GREETINGS! NGĀ MIHI!

I have already prepared a text for the front page of our newsletter when, on Thursday morning, we were all shocked by the shooting attack in Auckland CBD. For a moment, we were all frozen, waiting for the development of the story. The moment when we learned that there are injured, and later killed people, were moments of profound sadness. Our hearts instinctively went and still are with those affected by this senseless shooting, especially the families who have lost their dear ones. We embrace also those who have suffered in any way. We also give thanks to God for the police force, all medical staff, as well as all who responded to this crisis.

As a Cathedral we immediately offered our space for prayers and reflection: a prayer was written, based on already existing materials, we have invited the community via social media to come and join in reflection and prayer, with lighting of candles. A service at 3 pm helped us to mediate and reflect in this moment of grief.

We do not know all the details yet and we might learn more in days to come. But we wish to be a place that offers consolation and support and I am grateful that we were again able to respond in a moment when we could do so.

Let us pray this weekend especially for our City and for all of those wo make our lives safer. Let us pray for wellbeing of all, so that such situations would be avoided in future.

Events like this always remind us how inter-dependent we are. On Thursday I prayed: 'Life is short, and we do not have much time to gladden the hearts of those who travel the way with us. So be swift to love, make haste to be kind, and go in peace to love and serve the Lord.'

One of the wonderful principles of Judaism which I have learned about over the years from our Jewish friends in Beth Shalom Synagogue (and which, I am convinced, all of us as Christians could also live) is 'tikkun olam – healing/repairing the world'. It reminds us that we are all called to make this world a better place. So, may we all be healers of our City in the wake of this shooting attack.


