10am Sunday 20 March

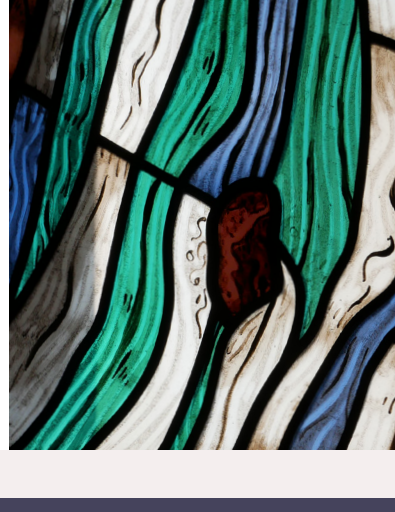
Third Sunday in Lent/Te Rātapu Tuatoru o Rēneti

AGM reports and nomination forms available on Sunday

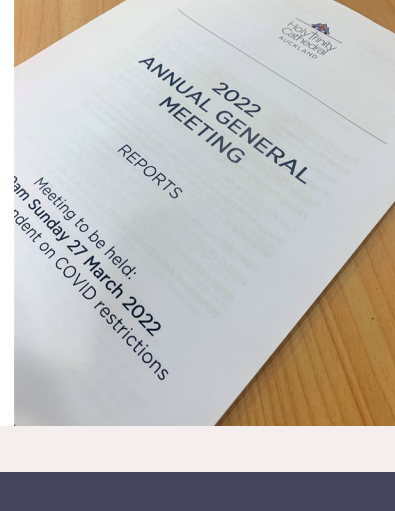
Our Annual General Meeting will be held at 11:30am on Sunday 27 March. The venue will be announced closer to the time depending on what is possible under COVID restrictions.

in support of the Eparchy of Križevci

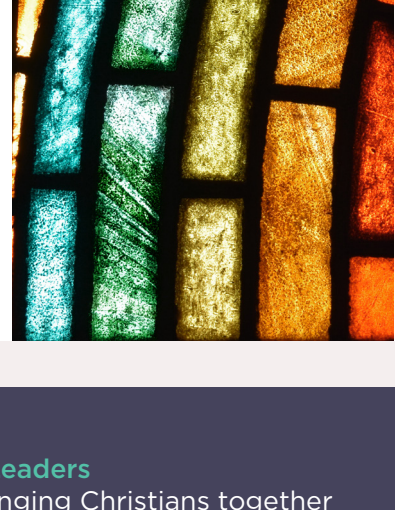
During Lent, as Christians, we are invited to show solidarity with those in need and those experiencing oppression and suffering.

LENTEN STUDIES 2022

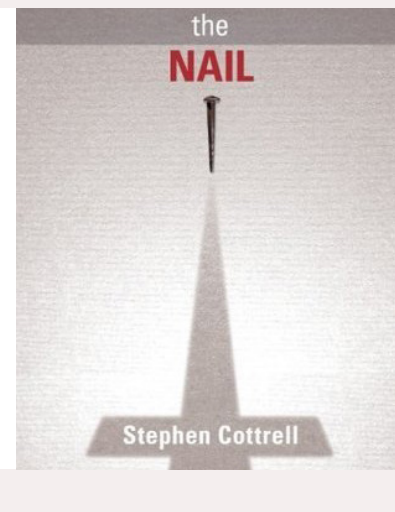
7:30pm Mondays 7, 14, 21, 28 March & 4 April

PALM CROSS WORKING BEE

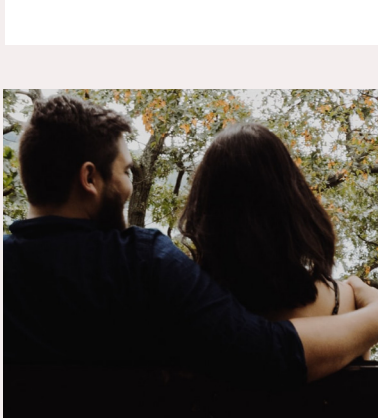

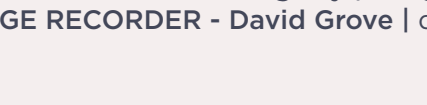
