Dear friends,

Ngā mihi o Matariki, te tau hou Māori – happy Matariki Day, happy Maori New Year!

I hope that all of you have found ways to participate and rejoice in our newest public holiday, which has the longest history of all. Some of you, who are early risers, might have been at our marae, observing the sky and celebrating with the community. Others may have chosen to mark the day (or weekend) with some special meals, with food from earth, sky and water. And perhaps some of you are grateful for the extra time to reflect and spend quality moments with loved ones.

The wider consumerist society has found creative ways to incorporate this day into their activities. Liturgical materials for use in Tikanga Pākehā are prepared and will continue to be developed. The evening services provide a great opportunity for us to embrace the values and themes of Matariki in our liturgical life. It will be interesting to see how we can adapt them for use in the Cathedral in the years to come.

We do acknowledge this day and give thanks to God, source of love for the world, for the beauty of our universe and the stars so wonderful, that we can admire them. We exult with the words of Benedicite Aotearoa: “You sun and moon, you stars of the southern sky: give to our God your thanks and praise.”

One way in which Matariki speaks to me is:

- It invites us to look back and remember, especially dear ones who have died;
- It is a moment of re-assessment and reflection on the moment in which we are;
- It helps us to turn towards the future and plan months ahead.
- In this way, it is a good season to allow us slow down from our usual manic rhythm of life.

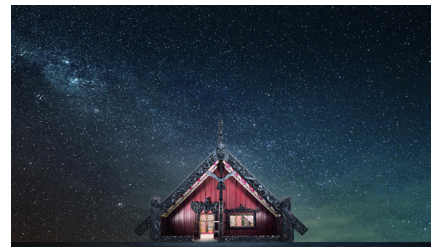

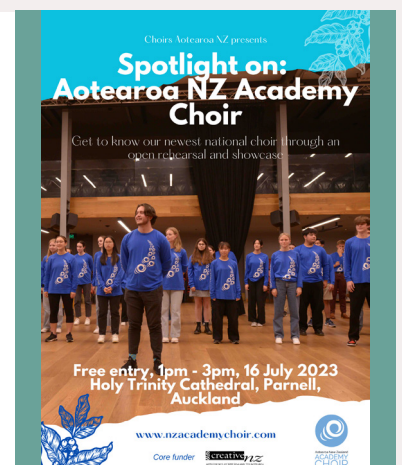

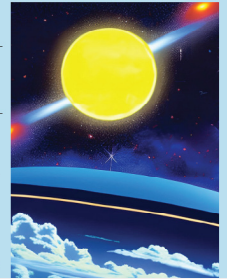
Themes in Contemporary Science Fiction
