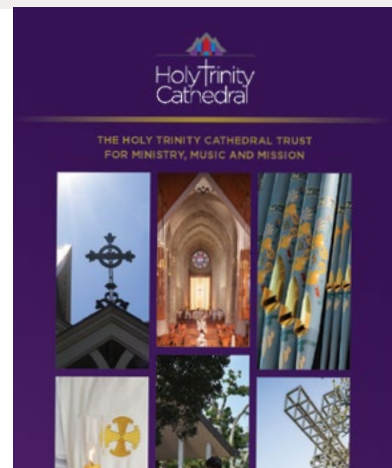
THE CATHEDRAL TRUST

More details of this year's speakers will follow shortly but please put these dates in your diary as ones not to be missed!

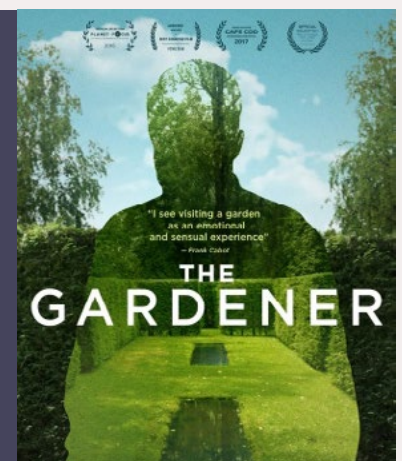
