## CANDLELIGHT CONCERTS

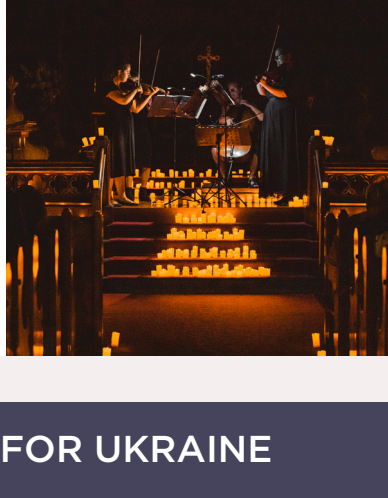
Dates in May and June

Masks will be compulsory for attendees of the market.

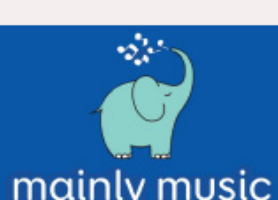

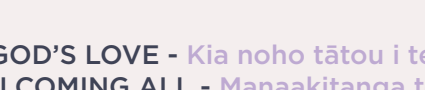
