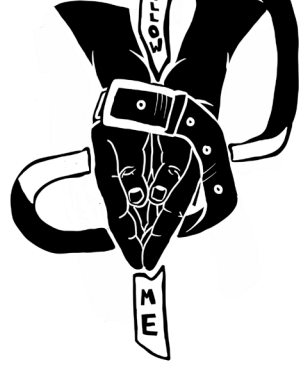
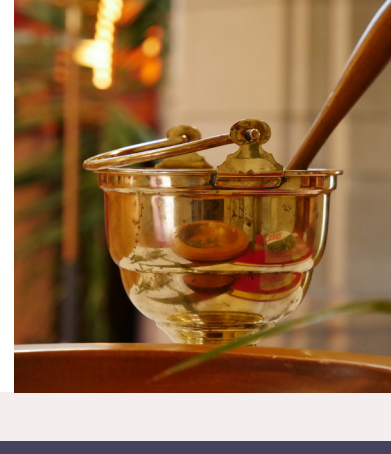

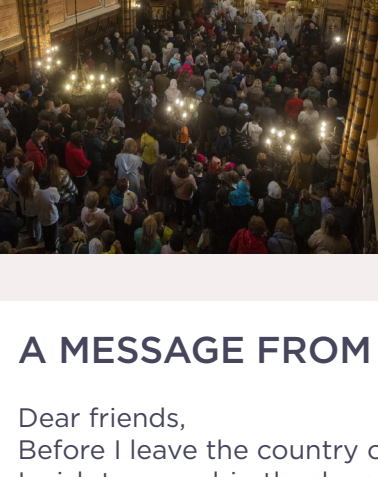
CATHEDRAL LENTEN APPEAL FOR UKRAINE

During Lent and Holy Week, Holy Trinity Cathedral was privileged to support the Greek-Catholic Eparchy (Diocese) of Křiževci. This final sum will be gifted to the Eparchy to support their ongoing efforts on behalf of Ukrainian refugees in Croatia. 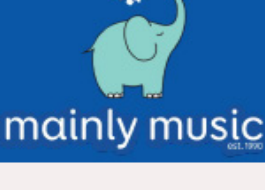
THE PASSION OF CHRIST

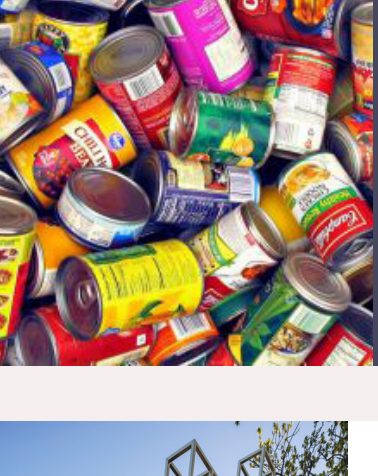
