GREETINGS! NGĀ MIHI!

One of the exciting things in the life of a Precentor is the diversity of the liturgical celebrations we have in the Cathedral. Apart from the diverse and regular rhythm of prayer, with Eucharists, Evensongs and Taizé Prayer, it is always good when we are able, as a Cathedral community, to be a part of worldwide events, or when we reach to the broader community of Tamaki Makaurau – Auckland.

The two coming Sundays will bring us some excitement and I wish to invite all of you to join us. On Sunday, 1 October, at our Choral Evensong at 5 pm, we will be joined by the St Mary's Singers. That service will be a special one, as we will be joining the world-wide ecumenical community, at the invitation by Pope Francis, Patriarch Bartholomew of Constantinople and Archbishop Justin of Canterbury in prayer called 'Together – Gathering of God's People'. Christians of diverse denominations, across the world, join in their prayers for the successful work of the Synod of Bishops in Rome. Our Cathedral is one of only two NZ churches joining that initiative. We do hope to be joined with some of our ecumenical friends.

On Sunday, 8 October, at 1.30 pm in the Bishop Selwyn Chapel we will host, for the first time, a Service to remember all the babies gone too soon. We are organising this service together with Sands Auckland Central. Our Cathedral has for three years been part of a 'global wave of light', which colours many significant buildings in rose and pink hues, in memory of children who have died prematurely. It is through that connection with the community that Sands (Auckland) has decided to partner with us to host such a meaningful service.

Feel free to check the websites for both events. I do hope both of these services will offer us the opportunity to reflect how we can be relevant beyond our congregational life, and how are we able to connect with others. Do join us as we journey together!

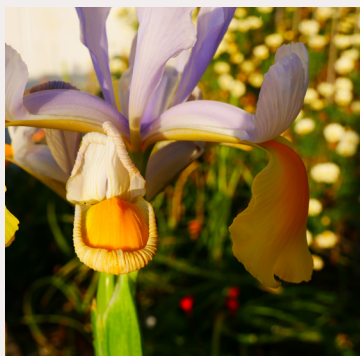
