- where possible, maintain a 1m distance from others.

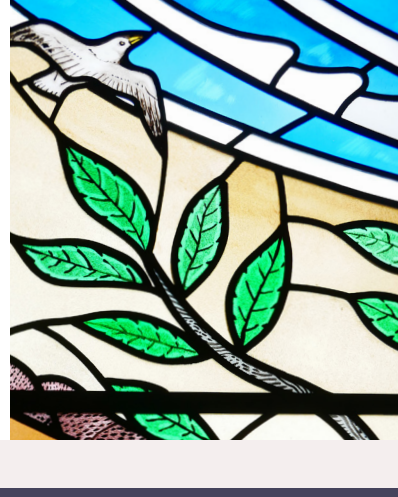

VISIO LECTIO - A VISUAL LECTINARY

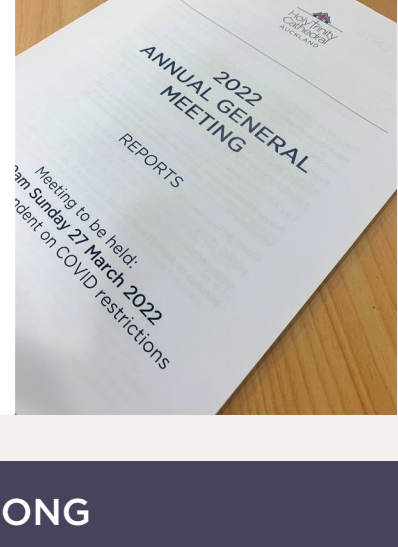
Gospel reading for the Second Sunday in Lent

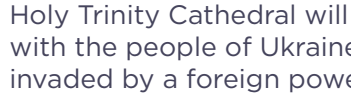

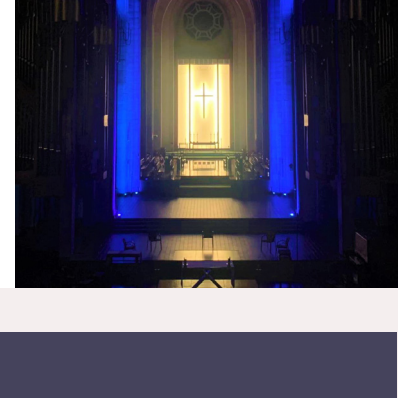

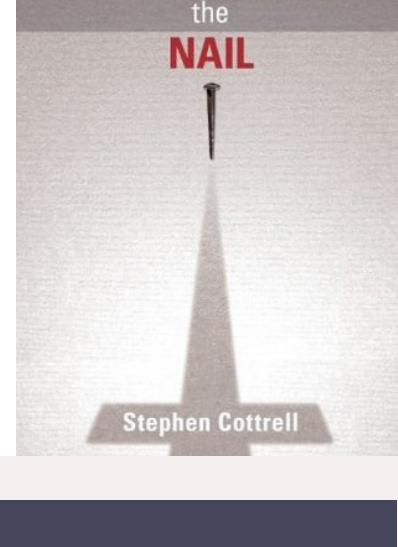
Lenten reflections from Auckland Church Leaders

PALM CROSS WORKING BEE

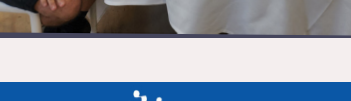
10am Thursday 7 April

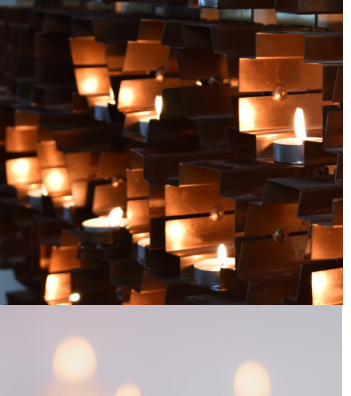
