YouTube is one of the great modern social media. I like to use it a lot. Recently, I have decided rewatch the already classic 'Agatha Christie's Poirot', filmed between 1989 and 2013, with the legendary David Suchet as the lead character (bottom right). The quirky Belgian detective, with his often all too continental solutions for those around him, was part of my growing up in the nineties.

I find myself doubly grateful to the YouTube algorithms, as they have brought to my attention to two of Suchet's documentaries about St Paul (2012) and St Peter (2014). Each documentary consists of two 50-minutes parts where the author's scholarly approach, natural kindness and Christian faith tell the story of these two important Christian saints in their proper context. I couldn't let them go and I watched them in two evenings.

St Paul is an important person to Suchet. Though of Jewish and Christian background, he was raised in a non-religious environment until an encounter with Paul's letter to the Romans brough him to the Christian faith in 1986. He stated in an interview with Strand Magazine, 'I'm a Christian by faith. I like to think it sees me through a great deal of my life. I very much believe in the principles of Christianity and the principles of most religions, actually—that one has to abandon oneself to a higher good.'

I, myself, personally took more enjoyment from the second documentary about St Peter. I recommend that you use the links below to view them


Sunday 21 August - are you interested to see more?
