THE CHILDREN ON ABRAHAM ANNUAL PANEL 2022 - LEARNING FROM EACH OTHER

Judaism, Christianity and Islam, are all religions with their roots going back to Abraham. 'Children of Abraham'—an Abrahamic religions interfaith initiative formed by Pearl of the Islands Foundation, Beth Shalom Progressive Synagogue and Holy Trinity Cathedral—exists to promote mutual understanding, cooperation and pro-active inclusion of all who stand in the Abrahamic tradition.

This annual panel discussion organised by the 'Children of Abraham.' was held in the Bishop Selwyn Chapel on the evening of Monday 7 November. Thank you to all who came along to hear from our esteemed panelists: Jules Gaddie - Jewish Mentor; The Reverend Richard Bonifant - Anglican Priest; and Dr Salih Yucel - Associate Professor. We hope you found the evening as enriching and educational as we did! The questions put to the panel for discussion were:

1. Although we all descend from Abraham, our religions have diverged over the centuries. How would you describe the fundamental belief system of your faith?
2. What are the main texts that are sacred to your faith.
3. Do we all share the same God?
4. What is the role of head coverings, if any, in your faith?
5. What are the rules regarding alcohol in your faith, and if allowed, how is it used in your worship.
6. What are your most important festivals and how are they observed?
7. What does your faith do in the pursuit of social justice?
8. What is the most commonly held misconception about your faith?
9. What is the most precious aspect to you about your faith.

ABOUT OUR SPEAKER

Hear from Paul Baragwanath Māhono, Founder of the Friends of St David's Trust, now also known as Kāhui Rangi Pūpū (gathering of the heavenly trumpets), on the nail-biting eight-year campaign to save St David's, the World War One Soldier's Memorial Church and "Cathedral of the Presbyterial Church" for the people of Auckland.

Holy Trinity Cathedral is forming two new Children's Choirs!

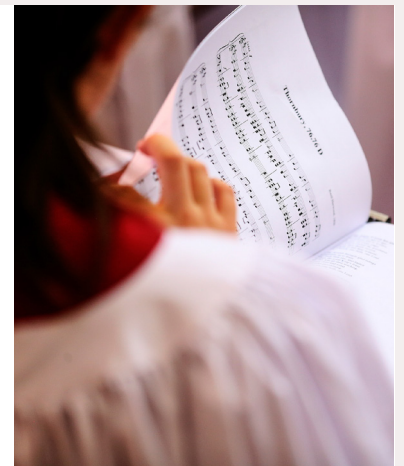
We are looking for children between 8 and 14 years of age who want to grow their talent for music and learn
