While we will continue offering Communion in both kinds, we are mindful that you may feel uncomfortable receiving the wine. We would like to reiterate that receiving communion in one kind (the bread only) is considered by the Church to be a full participation in the sacrament. It is therefore entirely at each individual's discretion to take Communion in both kinds or to continue receiving the bread only. The way we administer Communion at the Cathedral makes it easy for you to receive in one or both kinds and return to their seats so whatever is most comfortable for each person is absolutely acceptable.

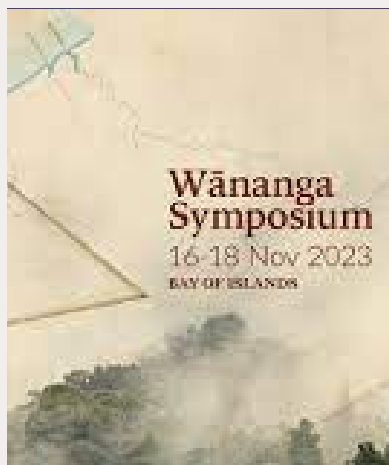

### What's the latest news on the corner development?

Activity is starting to pick up pace on the corner site apartment block, especially now that the developer has Resource Consent in place.

We can expect to see the crane go up and piling and excavation get underway over the coming weeks. You might recall there will be two underground carpark floors, and then 6 floors comprising 27 apartments. All of the site access will be from Brighton Rd so there will hopefully be minimal disruption to the rest of the Cathedral precinct. We have been advised by the developer that apartment sales are going well, especially now that they are into their public marketing phase. Clearwater Construction is the builder, and they will be utilising the Brighton Rd carpark for the 27 month duration of the project, providing some valuable carpark rental for the Cathedral over that period. The staircase and alleyway from that end of the precinct up to the Visitors Centre and Cathedral entrance will remain open and accessible for the duration of the building project.

If you are interested you can find out more information about the apartments by clicking above, or you can call into the show home which is now open 10am-midday most days. As a Cathedral community we have been invited to a morning tea in the Show Suite after our 10am service on Sunday 21 August, and depending on your head for heights you may wish to scale the scaffolding to see the remarkable views for yourself.
