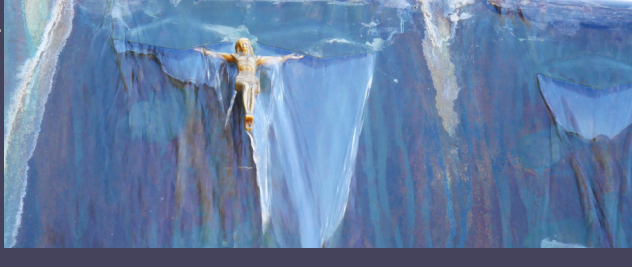

CHORAL EUCHARIST

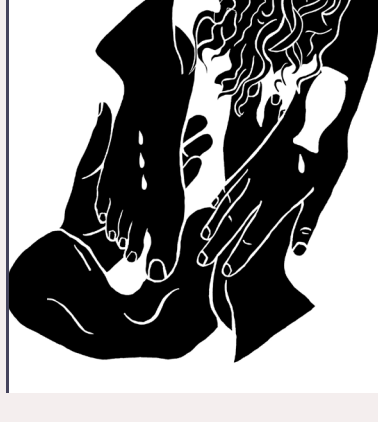
10am Sunday 3 April

DEAN'S REPORT

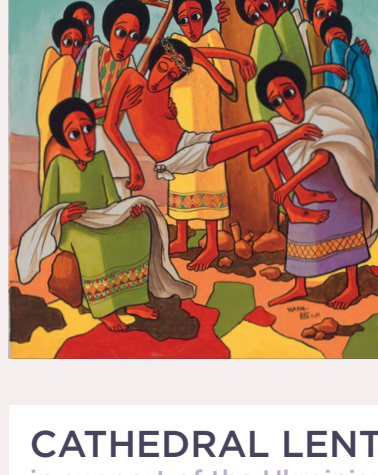
to the 2022 Annual General Meeting held on Sunday 27 March

in support of the Ukrainian refugees in the Eparchy of Križevci

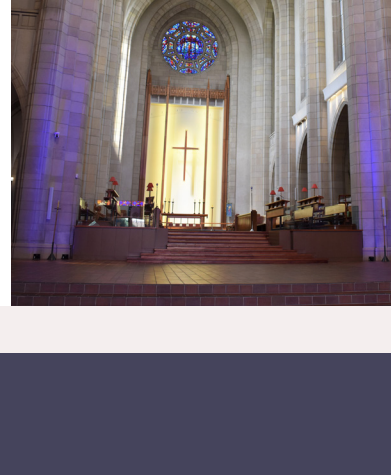
During Lent, as Christians, we are invited to show solidarity with those in need and those experiencing oppression and suffering.

KNEE RUG FUNDRAISER

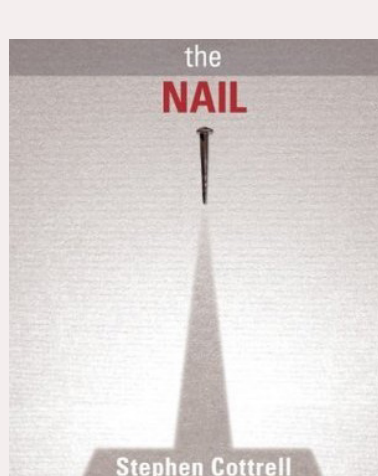
in support of the Ukrainian refugees in the Eparchy of Križevci

HOLY WEEK AND EASTER

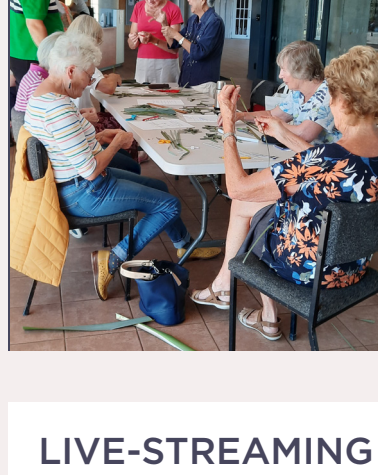
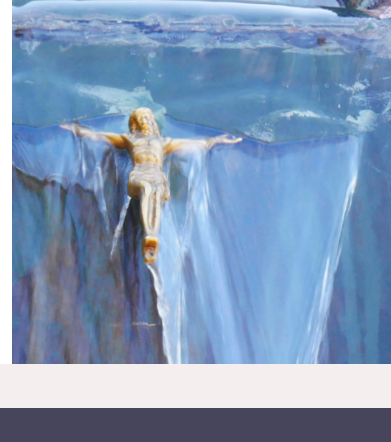
Sunday 10 - Sunday 17 April

SUPPORT THE AUCKLAND CITY MISSION

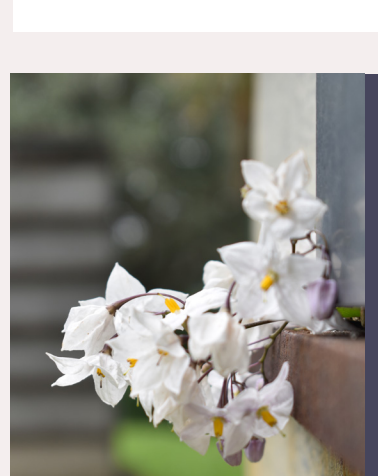
Sam and Irene's story
