

GREETINGS! NGĀ MIHI!

It is the feast day of Transfiguration. Jesus is on the mount, in the company of Moses and Elijah. The disciples are there too, and they are perplexed. It is definitely one of the experiences that is so engaging, that they wish to extend it. They wish to stay on the mountain and enjoy. But they need to descend and continue their ordinary lives, lives that will lead to misunderstanding and conflict.

It is important to notice that Jesus is not in competition with Moses and Elijah – there is a consent. What has really happened on that mountain – we cannot say for certain. Scriptures describe the event, many preachers try to explain it to us, I do not doubt that Archdeacon Michael, who is with us today, will try to do the same. Great theologians of Church history have tried to offer their answers. One of the most prominent, but not so well known in the Christian West, is the 14th century Byzantine Greek theologian and cleric (later canonised saint) Gregory Palamas. As a monk on Mount Athos, he was a strong defender of the hesychasm, which is a contemplative monastic tradition of the Church since the 4th century, but very popular at his time on Mount Athos. The essence of his teaching is that the light that the disciples saw at the mountain during the Transfiguration was not created light, but an uncreated, divine one, as well as the ongoing idea that God took human nature in Jesus, in order to give divine nature to humanity. A lot was written and debated about Palamas, many will agree and disagree with him, unfortunately, many won't even bother with his reflections, claiming that they are not relevant and that we need something more engaging for the 21st century. I believe that we, as Christians, cannot give an answer to today's world, if we are not deeply rooted in our Christian whakapapa of holy tradition.

Jesus, Moses, Elijah. On Monday the Cathedral co-organised for the fifth time, and Beth Shalom Synagogue hosted, our interfaith panel Children of Abraham, together with the Pearl of the Islands Foundation. Every time I visit a synagogue, I am reminded of our links with our older Jewish brothers and sisters. Over the centuries and millennia, we have been a quite dysfunctional Abrahamic family. We were not even attempting to be in accord as these three figures at the Mount of Transfiguration. From a very strained relationship in the beginning – we just celebrated St Stephen, the first Christian martyr, killed in Jerusalem, all the way to the centuries of Christian antisemitism. Shoah of the 20th century has made us more sensitive to this relationship and we are learning how to be together on the journey as Christians and Jews. God's covenant was not revoked from the Chosen people of God. It was not replaced by something else. It is our task, despite the differences and still existing



misconceptions, as well as cultural (and political) differences, to work together, cherish each other, learn how to understand each other more and more. In that way, we will be transformed/transfigured, and we will offer it not only to our interfaith relationships, but to the world too!




WINTER LECTURES IN AUCKLAND IN AUGUST
