

The Corinthians – who were they?



"Love is patient, love is kind..." This is maybe the most famous quote from one of St Paul's Letters to the Corinthians. Who were the Corinthians and how did Corinth look like in the time of Paul?

Corinth was actually a vibrant city— it was the great cross-road of the ancient world. It was famous for the Corinthian Games, where young people took part in competitions: women were driving war chantots and contested in a 200 metre sprint but also in playing the lyre.

The church cut across socio-economic structure and mixed people together. Paul introduced a new Community of Faith where all members were free.

Kieran Fenn fms is a Bible scholar and has spent more than 40 years in Adult Education, teaching Scripture in New Zealand and abroad.
