

GREETINGS! NGĀ MIHI!

Synod is a representative body of the whole Diocese gathered under the leadership of the Bishop. This year we gathered in the Cathedral on 7-8 September, commencing with a service in St Mary's-in-Holy Trinity at which Archbishop Sione of Polynesia was the preacher. The agenda was much lighter than usual with only two bills – one being a new statute for the Auckland City Mission reflecting the significant changes that have occurred there. Of the seven motions, four required authorisations referred by the General Synod/Te Hīnota Whānui. This left only three motions to debate – on overseas missions, voting age proposals and removing fossil fuel investments from diocesan investments. As a result, Synod finished a day earlier than planned – a Saturday holiday being enjoyed by all.


The Diocesan Council reported on its work during the year including the launching of a programme "Flourishing Life on Church Land", while a review of Trusts Investments Management Ltd (TIML) provided opportunities for questions to be asked about financial performance issues experienced.

The Reverend Ivica Gregurec and Jessica Hughes from Holy Trinity Cathedral were both re-elected to the General Synod/Te Hīnota Whānui. Bishop Ross in his Charge covered several issues facing the Diocese. These included challenges brought by the January storms and cyclone Gabrielle, where not only many individuals were severely affected, but several church properties suffered damage, raising the question of not only repair costs but also future insurance premiums. Two reports to be published shortly would cover historic abuse issues, but he emphasized that corporate responsibility was needed to address such problems.

He devoted considerable time to issues being faced not only by the Diocese but also by most ministry units – aging congregations, decline in attendances, juggling finances, managing compliance issues etc. These were placing pressures on many ministry units most of which could not be solved centrally. As he pointed out, these were "the primary place for our mission", namely where we connect with our local communities and where relationships can be developed to allow the love of God to be shared so we can be part of the work of God's kingdom.

The Bishop focused on the concept of "Living Beyond Ourselves" with an emphasis on outreach and proclamation, the sharing of our faith through word and action. "Each of you is a strong part of the communities within which you live," he said. "You know these communities. You know their needs, the ways in which healing might come to people and places and thus the opportunities for the Word of truth to find a place. Those are the mission opportunities which God opens up before you." This led to considerable discussion and a motion was passed encouraging all ministry units "to actively consider the mission opportunities that exist in each of our communities and to develop plans to respond. "This is now the challenge for us to meet!


St Mary's will be opened for visitors to discover echoes of love. Everyone is invited.
