with His Eminence Archbishop Haigazoun Najarian

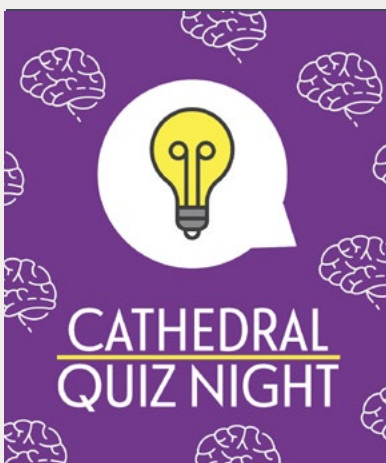

## REQUIEM FOR ALL SOULS

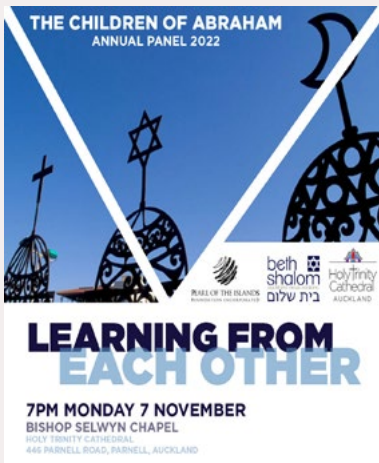
5pm Sunday 6 November

**Paul Baragwanath**

*'Your challenge, should you choose to accept it: to save an old, forgotten, Kāmo brick and Oamaru stone church building from destruction. Demolition plans are already under way, the risk of arson is high, the building has no historic heritage protection, you have no access inside, and after weeks of fundraising, you still have only \$200 in the kitty.'*

Hear from Paul Baragwanath MA(hons), Founder of the Friends of St David's Trust, now also known as Kāhui Rangī Pūpū (gathering of the heavenly trumpets), on the nail-biting eight-year campaign to save St David's, the World War One Soldier's Memorial Church and "Cathedral of the Presbyterian Church" for the people of Auckland.
