May the generosity of some cover the need of others!

Finally, and I will write more about it soon more in detail...part of our Cathedral ministry of hospitality is offering our 12.15 pm Eucharist, from Monday to Thursday. These services are not just for anybody visiting to drop in, but they are part of the ongoing rhythm of prayer in this place. I am hoping and praying for a group of people who would, over a period of a week or month, keep this ministry going. We, clergy, are here and available. Would you like to join and help?

SPOTLIGHT ON: AOTEAROA NZ ACADEMY CHOIR


10am Eucharist; 1-3pm, Sunday 16 July Holy Trinity Cathedral
