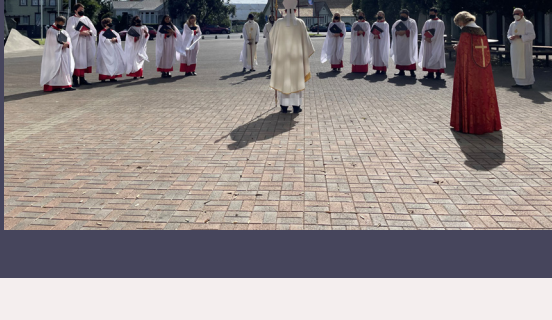
A heartfelt thanks to all those who worked hard to make our Holy Week and Easter services so special, and to all those who came to share in the profound joy of this Easter season.

10am Sunday 24 April

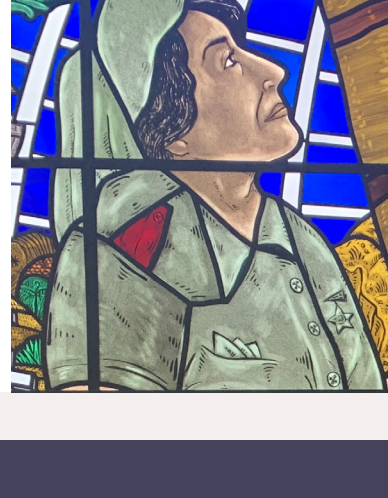
Low Sunday/Te Rātapu Tuarua o te Aranga

LIVE STREAMING

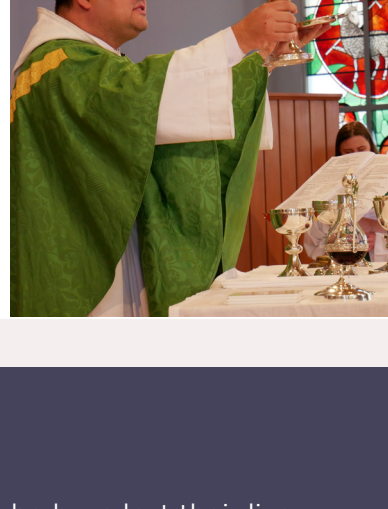
Cathedral service live streaming update

A letter to our community from the Bishop of Križevci

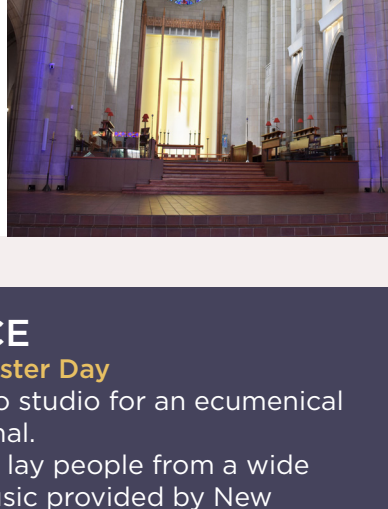
During Lent and Holy Week, Holy Trinity Cathedral was privileged to support the Greek-Catholic Eparchy (Diocese) of Križevci.

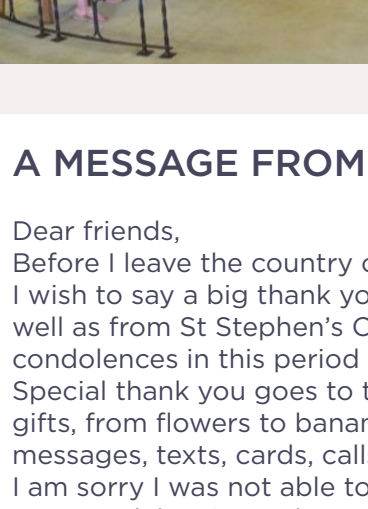
ECUMENICAL EASTER SERVICE

OPEN4EM

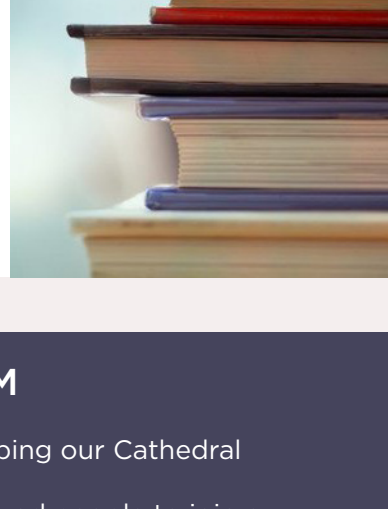
7pm Monday 2 May

CATHEDRAL GARDENING TEAM

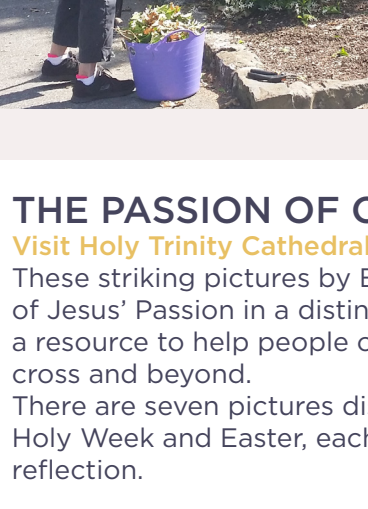
Join the Cathedral Gardening Team

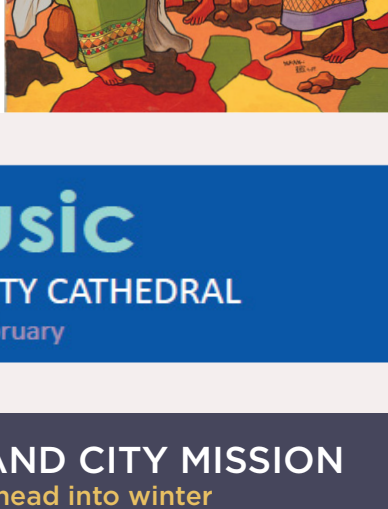
THE PASSION OF CHRIST

DONATIONS FOR THE AUCKLAND CITY MISSION

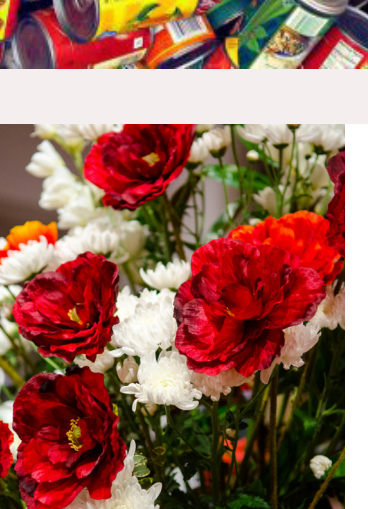
Please consider donating food items as we head into winter

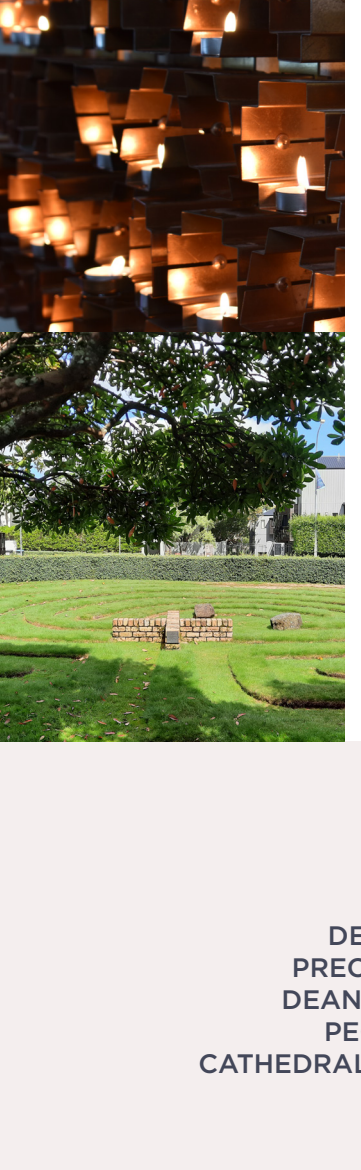
The Cathedral clergy maintain a pattern of daily prayer for our parish, diocese, nation, and world.

All prayers are treated as confidential.

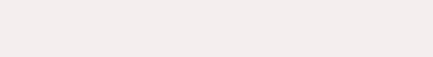
