After a hurricane rocked her home in Nicaragua, Kelly was glad to receive food and water filters from CEPAD. The storm destroyed ten latrines in their community, polluting the river, the source of their water.

CEPAD is supporting Community Development Committees to improve development opportunities for residents. By working in local communities, CEPAD enables people to find their own solutions to the challenges they face and prepare for droughts and hurricanes. Together we share joy when people have safe water.

FOR REFLECTION

Ask people to share a story or an activity that gives them joy. Encourage people to make connections and be brave.

Look for the joy in climate change. What opportunity could it give us in our community or in the vulnerable parts of the world?
