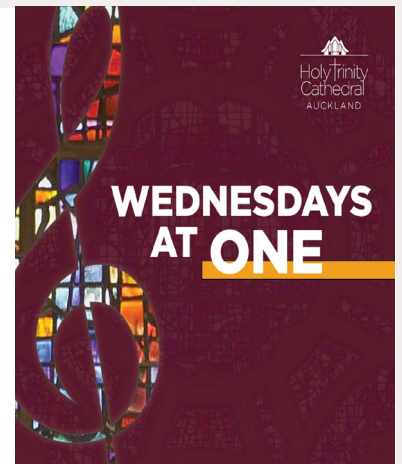
WEDNESDAYS AT ONE

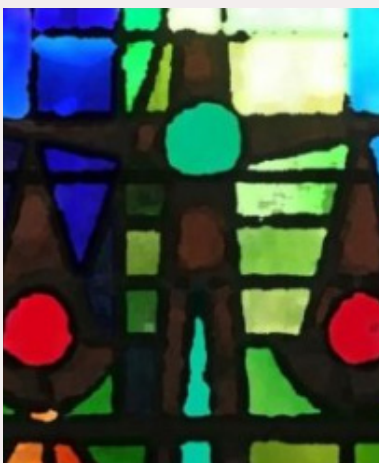
ECUMENICAL WORSHIP SERVICE
