LENTEN STUDIES 2022

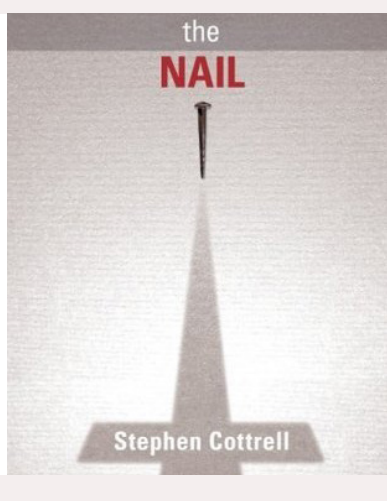
7:30pm Mondays 7, 14, 21, 28 March & 4 April
