LENTEN STUDIES 2022

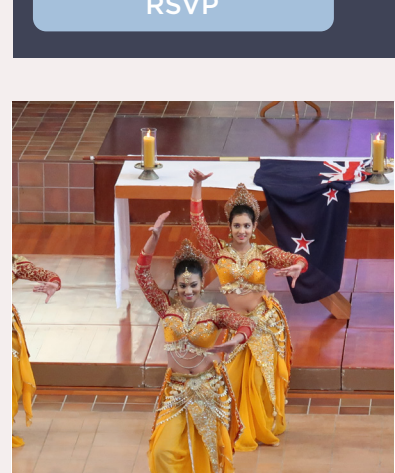
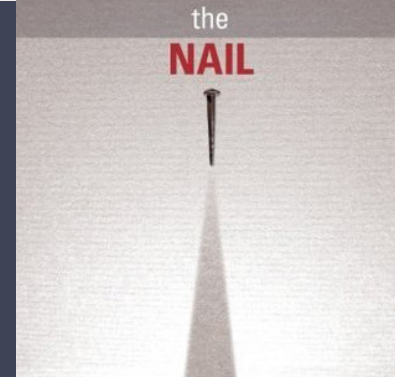
7:30pm Mondays 7, 14, 21, 28 March & 4 April

10am Thursday 7 April

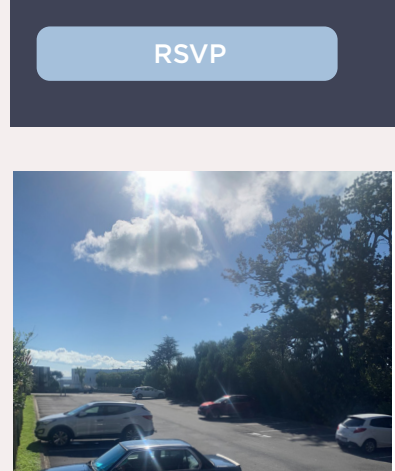

We look forward to watching the development progress over the coming months.

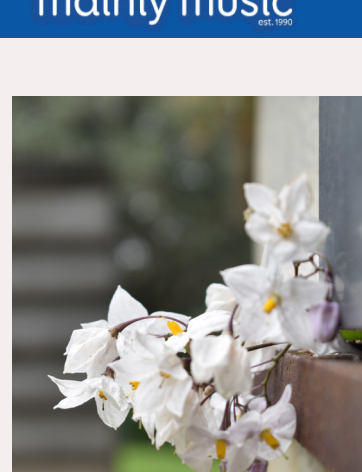

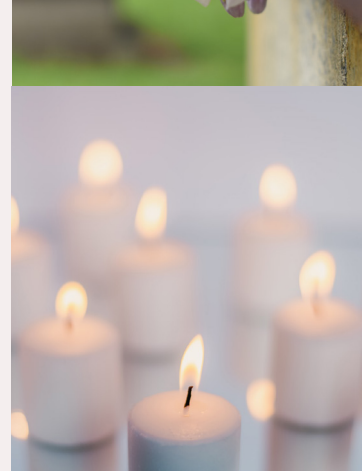
The Cathedral clergy maintain a pattern of daily prayer for our parish, diocese, nation, and world.
