

7-8:30pm, Wednesdays 5 July 2023



#### CATHEDRAL ACCESSIBILITY: FEEDBACK FROM THE CATHEDRAL COUNCIL

At its meeting last Sunday, the cathedral council looked at options for improving accessibility to Holy Trinity Cathedral, following on from discussion about this at the AGM. Because the number of disability parks on Parnell Rd is limited, two extra disability parking signs have been added to the main parking area behind St Mary's, adjacent to Parnell Rd and Cathedral Close. To make it easier to get into the cathedral for the 10am Sunday service, we'll also be having the Patteson Entrance (the one close to St Mary's) open before 10am each Sunday. Please use this entrance if it's better for you than having to walk all the way outside down to the main doors facing on to St Stephens Ave. Let us know if this is helpful! Once the temporary show-home apartment is removed from the area next to the office, some limited parking will be wwreinstated there. We'll let you know when this has been done.


#### HYMN FESTIVAL
