### HAPPY MATARIKI! MĀNAWATIA A MATARIKI!

This week, we will experience a 'first' in Aotearoa New Zealand. This Friday will be the first time Matariki/Māori New Year will be celebrated as a national holiday. This celebration traditionally coincides with the appearance of Matariki (The Pleiades constellation) in our winter night sky. You may read more information on Matariki and how we are celebrating at Holy Trinity Cathedral in this newsletter.

You will have noticed over the last weeks that our worship services are slowly returning to pre COVID order. The Bishop has signaled that Communion is now allowed in both kinds. From Sunday 3 July we will therefore be offering both bread and wine at Communion. Mindful of those who may feel uncomfortable in receiving the wine we would like to reiterate that receiving communion in one kind (the bread only) is considered by the Church to be a full participation in the sacrament. It is therefore



entirely each person's individual decision to decide if they will take Communion in both kinds or continue receiving the bread only.

The way we administer Communion at the Cathedral makes it easy for individuals to receive in one or both kinds and return to their seats. So whatever is most comfortable to each person is absolutely acceptable. As always please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.

The light show is part of a series of family-orientated twilight shows around Auckland. Entry is FREE.




### ATWC WINTER PJ APPEAL 2022
