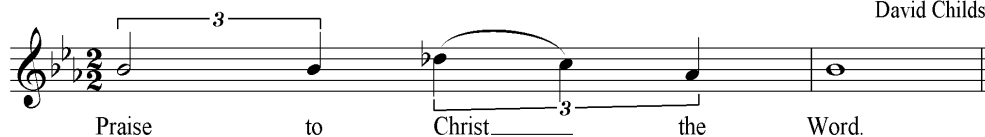

Winter Study Series: Beyond Worship - Exploring Spirituality.

Session One: Spirituality and the Arts, Sunday June 13th at 11.30 in the Oaks Room.

In Lent of this year, Sarah directed *The Howick Mysteries*, a passion play written for actors from the All Saints community. The seven performances were sold out with waiting lists. The experience was enormously significant - for actors and audience alike - generating remarkable theological reflection. In this first session Sarah will reflect on what has been a creative, collaborative exercise which put flesh on faith.

Jo is currently the vicar of the very vibrant parish of St Aidan's in Remuera. She brings to the Cathedral many well -developed skills and looks forward to the new challenges and responsibilities that being the Dean of a cathedral in a super city will offer.

She practised as a corporate solicitor before attending Bible College, where she gained her BDiv. Her legal training is still put to good use in that she is on the Diocesan council; she is the Auckland Diocese Rep to General Synod and on the Standing Committee. She takes a very active leadership role in all these places and is already highly regarded and respected.

Bishop Ross looks forward to working with her-and I believe they will be a good supportive team and provide a very satisfying working environment for the staff.

Jo has been in the Cathedral on many occasions and is aware of the excellent standard expected in our Cathedral music and all other aspects of our daily work in this wonderful place. She is very committed to the Cathedral being the place for leadership and hospitality and to Tikanga Maori and Pasefika in particular.

Having been a parish priest, she is also very aware of the value of supportive parishoners and lay people and as Vicar of Parnell is keen to support all ministries that encourage people into the Cathedral.

Howard will continue in his role as precentor, with the duties that that entails, and will be a helpful mentor and supporter for Jo as she moves from Parish Priest to Dean with all the learning curves that will entail.

Jo's installation will be held at the end of August. She brings with her husband Paul, and two boys; Adam 9 and Nathan 6.
