As we support and remember the work of the Auckland City Mission this morning, Gala and Victoria Madden, representatives from the 11+ Cathedral Kids group, will share with us their Lenten journey this year. In the weeks leading up to Easter the older KKs explored the issue of homelessness in Auckland and the gospel response to exclusion and poverty. As a part of this study the young people of Holy Trinity Cathedral visited the Auckland City Mission and donated food which they had prepared. The Cathedral Kids car wash which followed, raised more than \$400 to support the work of this Anglican outreach organisation.




