Andrew Rockell, a lay spiritual director and Christian meditation coach working from Cityside Baptist Church, will assist us in four sessions to become more self aware, by finding for

ourselves those blind spots which hold us back and learning alternative ways to engage with what we face each day of our life. We come to know that we can respond to situations from a position of health rather than reacting out of our dysfunction.
