This interdenominational survey is held every few years and helps to give a broad picture of church life in New Zealand, and also provides helpful statistics and guidance for individual denominations. Anything we do to help discern what is working and what we might do that is different to advance the Kingdom of God in our community can only be helpful.

As we approach the General election it is encouraging to see the ways in which most of the political parties are embracing sustainable environmental policies. Next Sunday (20<sup>th</sup>), we combine the feasts of the **Reign of Christ and Christ in all Creation**, to acknowledge that Christ is over all, in all, and through all.
