FROM THE CLERGY CORNER...

This week licensed clergy and lay ministers from the Auckland Diocese gathered for our annual Ministry Conference at Dilworth School exploring the theme *How do we sing the Lord's song in a strange land?* The Venerable John Day, Archdeacon for Mission in the Christchurch Diocese described Christchurch's defining moment - earthquakes which have forced them to re-think who they are and how they be Christ in their changed world. John explained that caring, praying, partnering, connecting and having a clear sense of our call to be Christ in the world are key our response when disaster strikes. Those communities in Christchurch that were strong, vibrant, well connected and outward looking were able to step up, work with and care for their wider community.

This conference has raises many questions for me: How ready are we for a disaster? How good is our caring, praying, partnering and connecting in Auckland? Do we have strong sense of our call to be Christ in Auckland? As individuals and as a community do we know how to keep ourselves safe? Do you have an emergency kit to survive for two days without food, water, power or a mobile phone? Do you have a "get away kit" with the clothing, documents and medication you would need if you had to leave your home at short notice? If not, why not?

I have realized that if we are not strong, vibrant and well connected, and if we can't keep ourselves safe, and we can't possibly hope to be Christ to those around us. One does not prepare to fail. One fails to prepare. I am going from here today to put my emergency kit together. What will you do?
