Cathedral Completion Building Project: The main aspects of this project are the building of the Chapel at the east end of the Cathedral behind the high altar, the joining of St Mary's and Holy Trinity (which will include a review of the St Mary's entrance way) and necessary restoration of the organ which also anticipates removal of the bridge. In December a

competition was launched through the New Zealand Institute of Architects for the design of the Chapel and joining of St Mary's and Holy Trinity. The submissions will be judged in February. Once submissions are received there will be a meeting of the Cathedral community to discuss the project, progress to date and the way ahead. A date for that meeting will be announced soon. The Big City Build In March this year Holy Trinity Cathedral and Habitat for Humanity are teaming up to build a home for an Auckland family in severe housing need. Upon completion it will be transported to Mangere, where the Fa'afiu family will begin their new life. We will be joined in fundraising, publicising and volunteering for this event by other churches and church schools across Auckland. Keep an eye out for fundraising events in these communities. A group from the Cathedral Community has already raised over \$5,000 by seeking sponsorship to run or walk the Auckland Marathon. To build this home we need plumbers, electricians, roofers and more. You can donate or help raise funds for all manner of items, such as nails, smoke alarms, floor vinyl, doors and windows. During the build we also plan a number of events to publicise the build and raise awareness of the need of decent, safe and affordable shelter, for families in Auckland and around the world. Any weird and wonderful ideas will be considered! We look forward to joining in this community outreach event together.
