From the Dean's Desk - *The Cathedral Completion Building Project*

During my sabbatical visits to Cathedrals, all of them were either in the midst of building work, had recently completed some or were making plans for more! Such is the life of Cathedrals it would seem. Work continues at pace on our Cathedral building project and we look forward with great anticipation to what 2012, and beyond, will have in store. This week the judging panel of the design competition for the Chapel and the connection of St Mary's and Holy Trinity will meet to begin the process of reviewing the entries. Panel members are the Archdeacon of Auckland, The Venerable Carole Hughes (as Bishop Ross' nominee); Bruce Gray (Cathedral member and representing the campaign committee); David Sheppard (an independently appointed architect from award winning Christchurch Architects Sheppard and Rout); and me. In addition, John Sinclair (architect and Cathedral member) is a consultant to the panel. I am very grateful to the panel members for their commitment of time and talents to this exciting chapter in our Cathedral's history. The panel's task, from the entries, is to agree a shortlist of 3 finalists. After that shortlisting process, plans will then be made for a meeting of the Cathedral community to see the designs, and to discuss the project, progress to date and the way ahead. The designs will be made available for wider viewing as well. A date for those gatherings will be determined in the next few weeks.
