From the Dean's Desk ... at Sarum College in Salisbury

Warm greetings everyone from autumnal Salisbury. This week I have been attending a Master's paper on approaches to Christian leadership. There have been 10 participants, Anglican, Methodist, Catholic and Baptist, coming from France, South Africa, England and NZ. It has been a great opportunity to hear what is current in both the secular and Christian thinking on leadership, to consider all of that in our context, and to do some self-reflection. One of our lectures this week has been on 'Liquid Church' which is part of the emerging church phenomenon of the last decade or two, very interesting! This opportunity, combined with my 'Cathedral crawl' is proving to be marvellous - and reminding me that there is no place like home! So far I have visited Dean Jane Shaw at Grace Cathedral in San Francisco, Dean Jim Kowalski at St John the Divine in New York, former Dean Justin Welby in Liverpool (now Bishop Justin of Durham) and this weekend Dean June Osborne at Salisbury. In all these places I have met with a considerable number of the Cathedral staff and volunteers and had the opportunity to take part in Cathedral life. We have also visited the Cathedrals and Minsters in Carlisle, Winchester, Durham and York. I will write in more detail for the next Trinity Life - but safe it say it has been a great blessing. Next week I am in the Anglican Communion office for meetings as we prepare to host ACC next year, then off to Lichfield for the weekend and finally Guildford Cathedral before we return home. Our time away has also been a great family time and this week, while I am in Salisbury, Paul, Adam and Nathan are taking in some London sites and adventures - including a bit of Arsenal! Everywhere I have been people have been keen to know about ministry in our context and most had already taken a look at our Cathedral on the website, or had visited, and think that it looks amazing. It has also been great to celebrate a World Cup win - especially when we watched the game in a room full of English and French people!
