FROM THE DEAN'S DESK....

Welcome, welcome, welcome! Today we are delighted to welcome Bishop Sunil Singh, Bishop of Delhi. Bishop Sunil is joined by his wife Rekha and two children, Ramona and Sonal. Bishop Sunil and his family have been in New Zealand for the Common Life Conference on Evangelism that took place in Waikanae last week. Bishop Ross and several representatives from our Diocese were in attendance also. Bishop Sunil studied arts and theology, has a post graduate diploma in management and has published works. In ministry, Bishop Sunil has a special concern for prayer, evangelism and mission. With that in mind he has created partner Diocese in Australia and Toronto. At the Common Life Conference Bishop Sunil spoke about reality of Christian mission in a context where Christianity is a minority religion. In India Christians are 2.5% of the population. In our Cathedral community this week we also welcome Edward Picton-Turbervill, the new Belinda Godfrey Memorial Organ Scholar. Edward comes to us from Eton for his gap year. On his return to England in 2012, Edward has been awarded the organ scholarship at St John's College, Cambridge. As well as being Organ scholar here at Holy Trinity, Edward will be a tutor at King's College. A warm Holy Trinity Cathedral welcome to Bishop Sunil, Rekha and their family, and to Edward.
