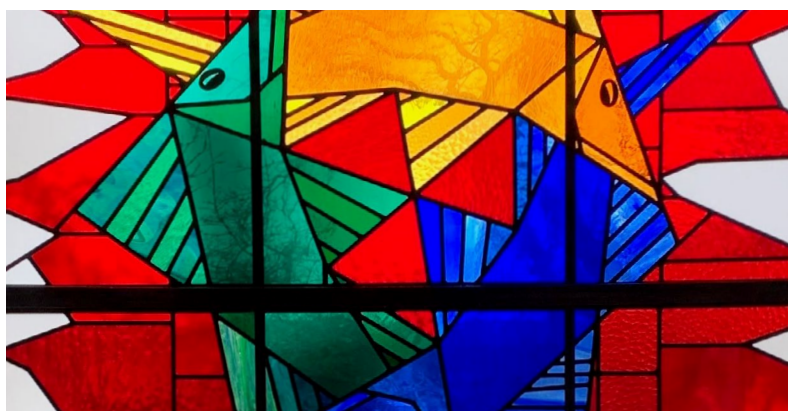


THE DAY OF PENTECOST

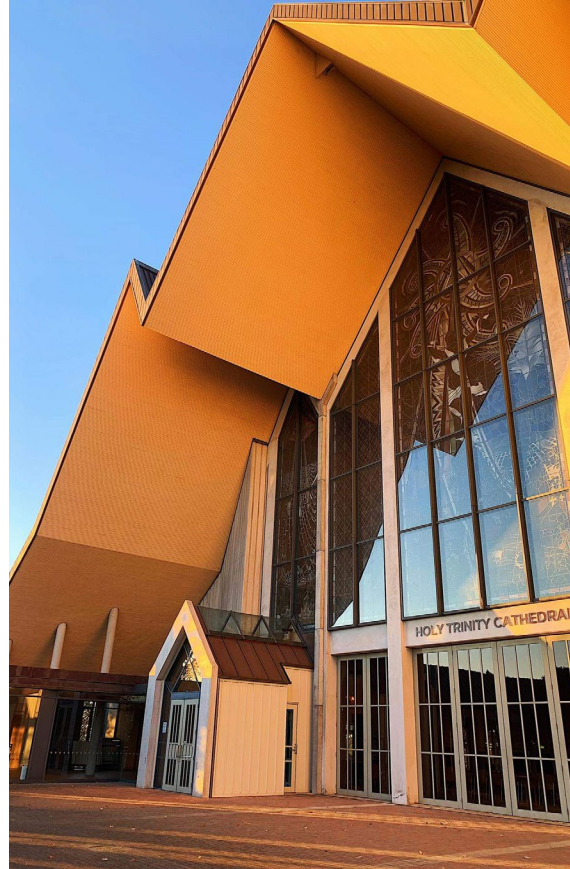
