**Bishop Selwyn Chapel**

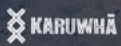
Join us over two Sundays when we will share soup and rolls after the 10am Eucharist followed by a special viewing of this new film in two parts.

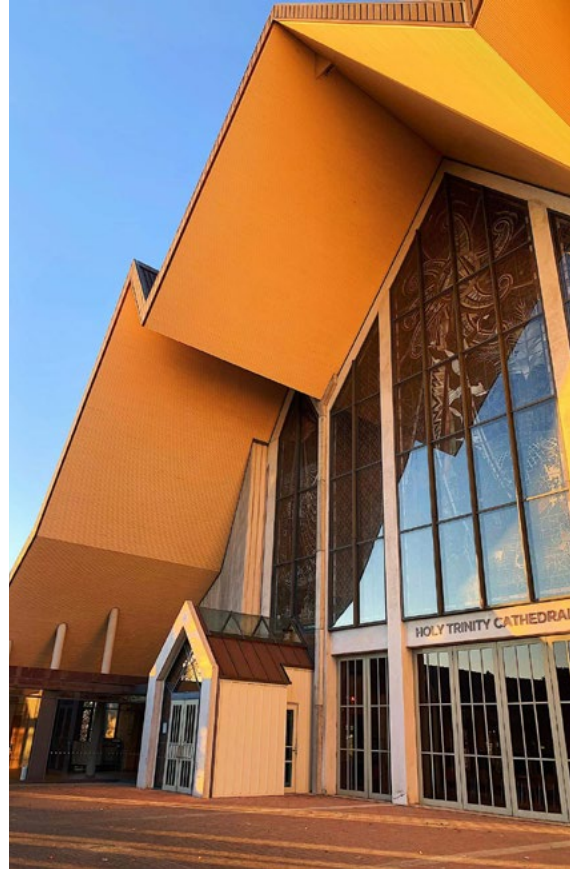
