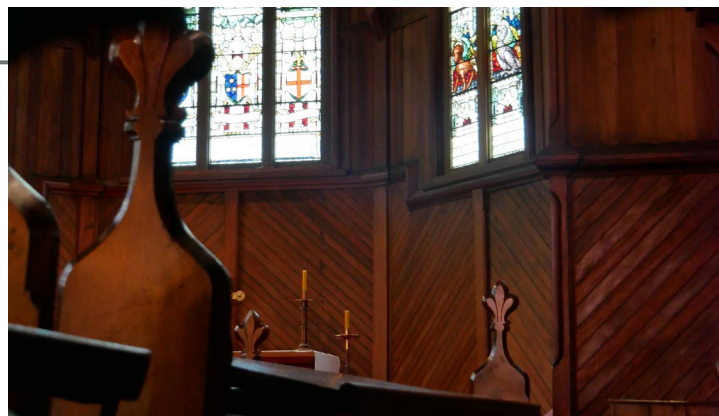

As we mark ANZAC Day this year, we pause to remember with deep gratitude and solemn respect the people of New Zealand and Australia who have served—and continue to serve—in times of war, conflict, and peacekeeping.

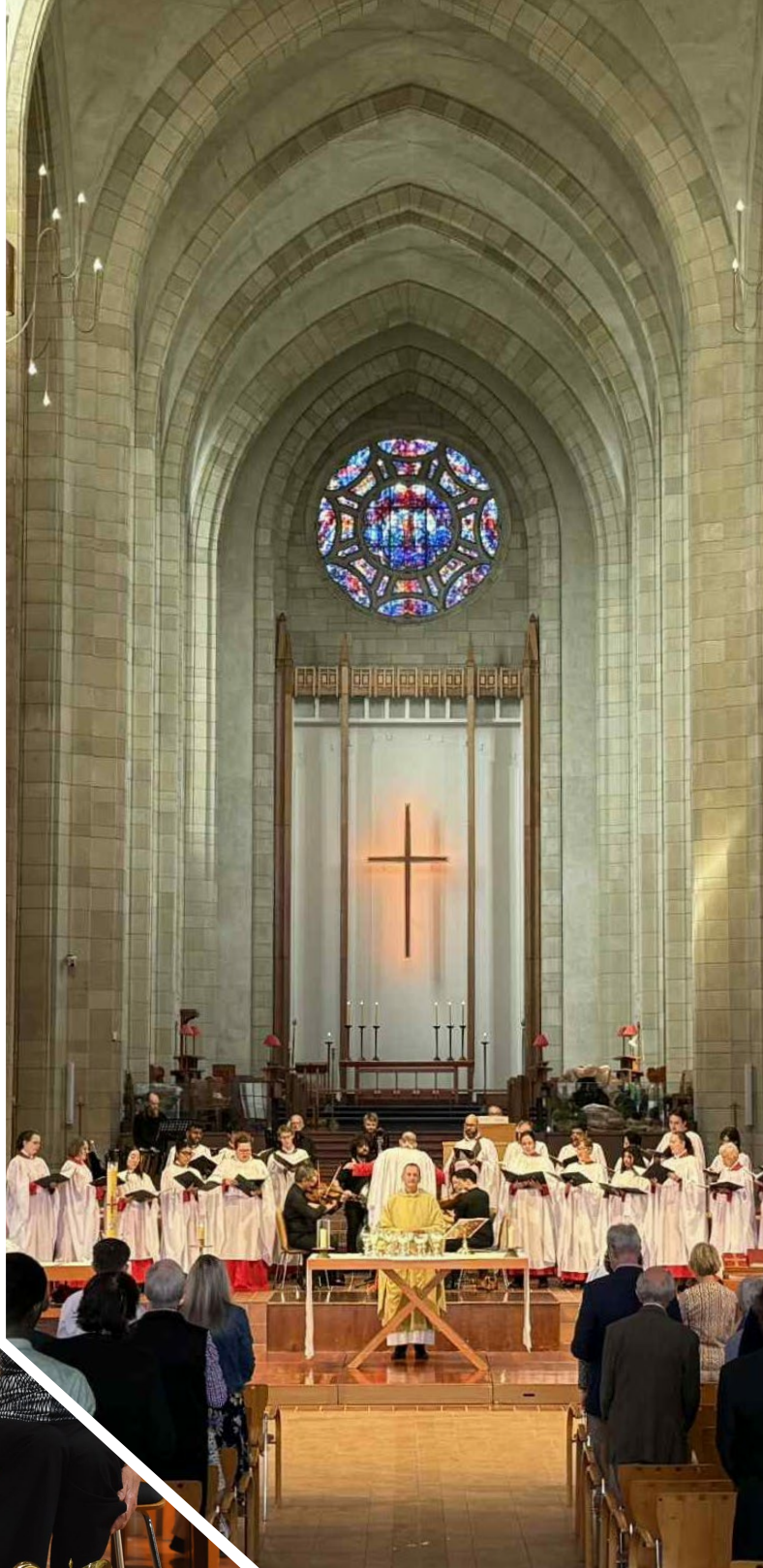
HOLY WEEK & EASTER

The Cathedral was filled with music, praise, and a deep sense of renewal as we celebrated the resurrection together. The Cathedral Kids hunted for eggs around the precinct and wove little baskets while learning the Easter story.

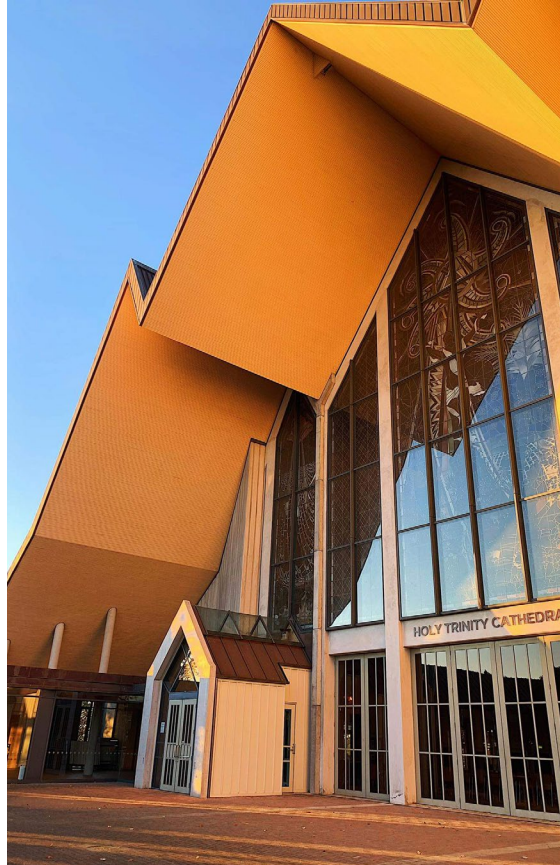
