GREETINGS • NGĀ MIHI NUI

As I write, representatives from across the Anglican Church in Aotearoa, New Zealand and Polynesia are gathering in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, for the 67th General Synod / Te Hīnota Whānui, being held from 15–21 August and hosted by the Diocese of Polynesia.

General Synod meets every two years and brings together bishops, clergy and lay representatives from our three tikanga. It is an important opportunity to worship, listen, discern and make decisions about the common life and mission of our Church. Its work includes receiving reports, electing people to Church bodies and considering legislation that shapes our shared life.

This year's gathering in Tonga is particularly significant as it reminds us of the breadth of our Anglican family across Aotearoa, New Zealand and the Pacific. The theme, "One Mission, One Ocean, One Vaka," speaks beautifully of our shared journey and our responsibility for God's creation.

I encourage you to follow the proceedings through Anglican Taonga, and to hold those gathered in your prayers as they seek wisdom and discern God's call for our Church.

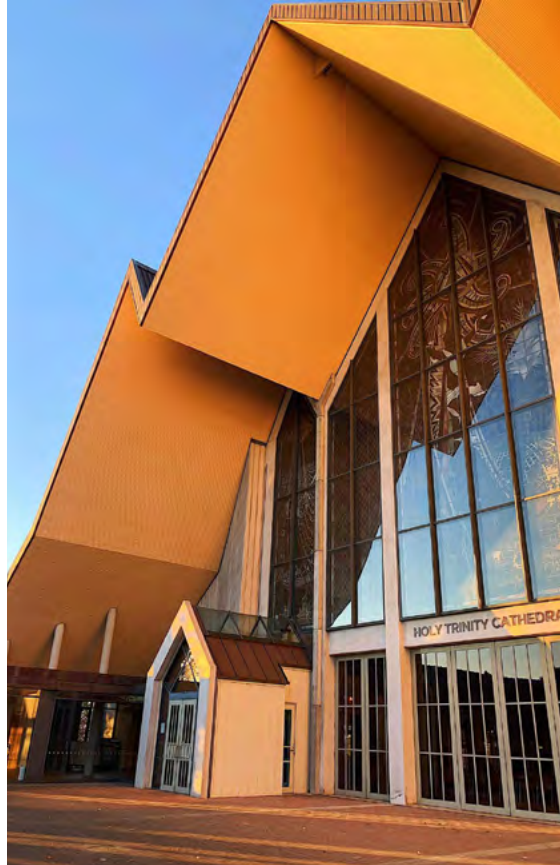
