AN ECUMENICAL VISIT

Last week, Fr Ivica and I hosted Bishop Mykola Bychok, and Fr Andriy Mykytyuk of the Ukrainian Greek Catholic Eparchy (Diocese) of St Peter and St Paul, Melbourne, together with some of our ecumenical friends. Bishop Mykola and Fr Andriy spoke to us of the work of the Church in Ukraine, its history and ministry to the people struggling during the war and aggression.

Their visit ended with the singing of "Molytva za Ukrayinu - Prayer for Ukraine" by Ukrainian composer Mykola Lysenko, as well as the waiata "Te aroha". It was wonderful to welcome all present to our Cathedral.

JIAXING ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

At our 10am Choral Eucharist last Sunday, we welcomed in our midst students and teachers of Jiaxing Elementary School. Jiaxing Elementary has 94 students from villages in Jian-Shir Township, Hsinchu County in the north of Taiwan. The age of the students is between 6-12, and more than 96% of the students are Atayal which is the third-largest aboriginal group in Taiwan. They are visiting Aotearoa New Zealand in order to present their singing skills, as well as to learn about Māori culture.
