When I'm late to AA, the meeting comes to a halt and everyone jumps up to hug and welcome me. They realize that my lateness may be a sign that I almost didn't make it. When I show up, it proves that my desperate need for them won out over my desperate need for alcohol.'

Yancey continues: 'Let's make sure that people know how welcome they always are, that our table is really big and that there is always a place with their name on it at our table.'



GAZA CEASEFIRE PILGRIMAGE

5:30am Saturday 16 March beginning at the Church of the Holy Sepulcre

Together we will walk, cycle or roll the length of Gaza - 41km - mirroring the journey Gazans are being forced to take to flee bombardment. Join some or all of the route with us. Please arrive at 5.30am for the briefing, at 6.00am the hīkoi begins.

The pilgrimage will follow the 14 stations of the cross. stopping at churches as well as sites of significance for our own setting in Aotearoa, with the intention of weaving our story a little deeper with those in Palestine. We'll also be raising funds to support the work of the Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees via Christian World Service.

This is a pilgrimage of solidarity and hope; we journey as witnesses and in love.
