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A MESSAGE FROM OUR NEW CATHEDRAL PRECENTOR



Greetings,

My wife, Christine and I will be arriving from Ōtūmoetai, where I have been serving as Vicar and as Chaplain to the Mission to Seafarers at the Port. Prior to this, I was Vicar in Geraldine for four and a half years, Acting Priest-in-Charge at Feilding, and completed my curacy in Halswell-Prebbleton. Christine and I have been married for nearly forty years. We have three daughters, five grandchildren, and a whippet called Brin. Christine is a Nurse Practitioner working in General Practice.

I came to ordained ministry later in life, having served in the New Zealand Army for nearly twenty-seven years. As an infantry officer, I spent two years in Singapore and completed three operational tours with the United Nations in Angola, East Timor, and the Solomon Islands. Alongside this were a range of training roles and, later, appointments in logistics staff. After leaving the Army in 2004, I worked in contract and project management, and for a short time drove heavy trucks and cranes.

I describe myself as a progressive inclusive. I am inspired by the Word of God and believe we are responsible for interpreting it faithfully for our time and place. Our calling makes us servants of the living God—called to love people of every faith and of none, especially those who struggle to love themselves, and to proclaim the good news of the Kingdom to the least, the last, and the lost. We are all made in God's image and share in the priesthood of believers, which means there is much for us to do together.

I enjoy meeting new people and look forward to getting to know you. I value working closely with existing teams, leaving in place what is already working well, and discerning where the Holy Spirit is leading through prayer and consultation.

We are very much looking forward to being with you soon and plan to move into the area in the last week of March, just in time for Easter.
