EASTER GREETINGS! NGĀ MIHI O TE ARANGA!

Having made the solemn Holy Triduum journey from Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil, through to the celebration of Easter Day we now sit in the season of Easter for another seven weeks. The Bible readings over this time invite a reflection not upon the miracle of the resurrection itself, but upon the community that is the astonishing outcome of that miracle. This community is an odd yet crucial presence in a culture of competition, conflict, isolation, and brutality. Easter makes a different way possible for them and for us in our time.

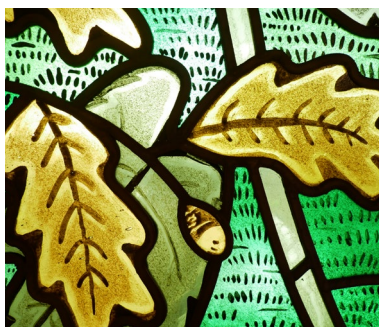
Next meeting: 7:45am Saturday 6 April | Waikaraka Park

CATHEDRAL ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

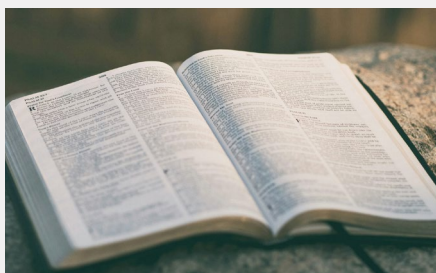

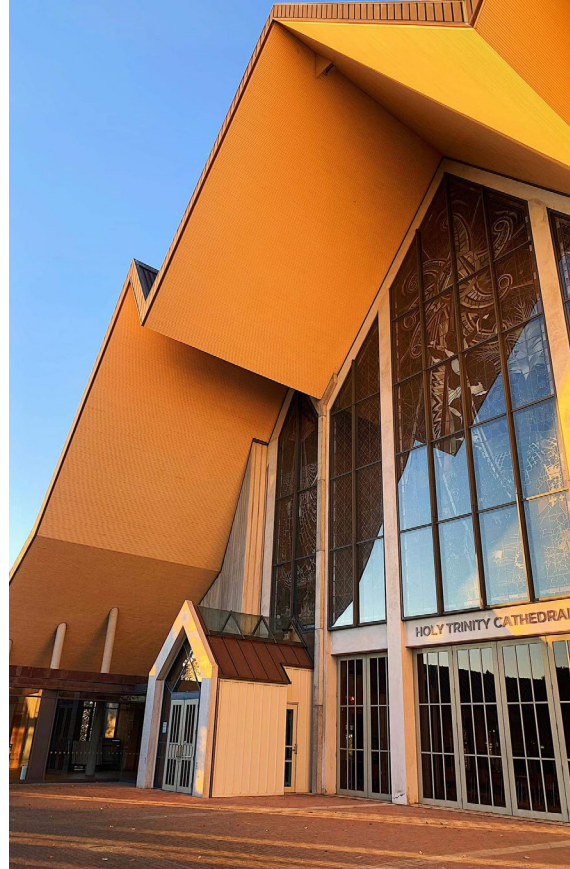
