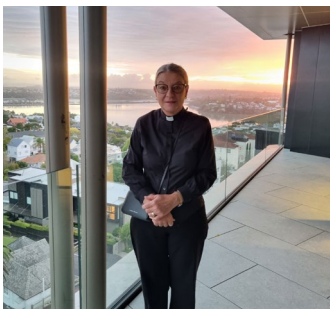

The building was then named before we all headed inside and up to Penthouse 502 to watch the sunrise. A wonderful occasion full of mana.



GREETINGS! NGĀ MIHI!

Here is a photo of Auckland City Missioner, Helen Robinson and me after our meeting with David Seymour MP last week. The meeting was in response to the Diocesan **Anglicans for Change** Campaign which the Cathedral supported late last year with a community petition as well as letters written individually to our political representatives. As a result of this campaign, Helen has also met separately with the Minister for Social Development, Louise Upston. I continue to work with Helen on the critical issue of the food crisis here in Aotearoa New Zealand, and will continue meeting with our local Government politicians. By the Mission's estimation, approximately one-in-five Kiwis go hungry and that is a sobering thought. After an hour with David, Helen and I felt that he had engaged with the issue and acknowledged the crisis and the vital work that the Mission does for those in most desperate need in our city of Tāmaki Makaurau. He assured us that he would take the issue to Parliament and see what funding could be given to such agencies as the City Mission across the country on a more permanent basis so that resources and support can be more securely relied upon in the future. Currently, the Auckland City Mission is operating with the promise of only six months of significantly reduced funding at any one time which we hope our representatives in parliament will be able to see is not sustainable and desperately inadequate to address the needs of the most vulnerable among us.

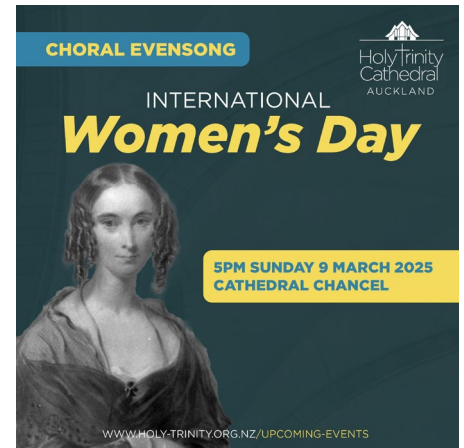
INTERNATIONAL WOMEN'S DAY CHARITY YOGA

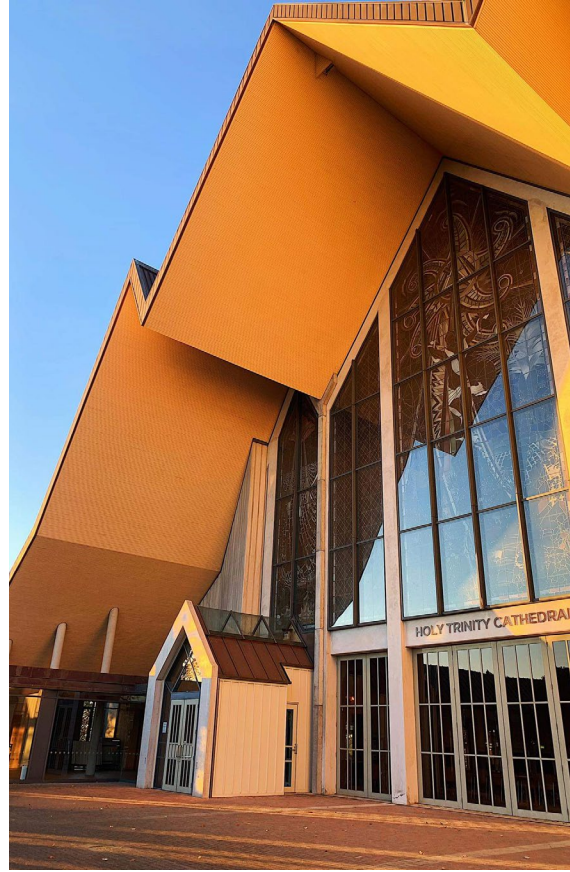
