Lent is a season in the Christian year focused on simple living, prayer, and fasting as we draw closer to God. It begins on Ash Wednesday and continues for 40 days (excluding Sundays) until Easter. In the early Church, Lent was a time of preparation for those being baptised at Easter. This preparation included prayer, fasting, self-examination, and repentance—practices that continue to shape the season today. During Lent, we turn away from the things that distance us from God and from one another. Through prayer, fasting, and generosity, we refocus our hearts on the good news of Christ's life, death, and resurrection.

Join us as we continue this prayerful journey toward the empty tomb with these Holy Week prayers by Reverend Kerry Greenhill, Associate Pastor at Highlands United Methodist Church in Denver, Colorado: Let us sing praise and glory to God.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

When the procession goes by and we rush out to join the fun, when we join the crowd in proclaiming God's wondrous deeds,

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

When we watch with curiosity as Jesus proclaims the truth, when we turn away from the spectacle to go back to our lives,

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

When we spread rumors of trouble or speculate about others, when we side with those in power out of self-interest or fear,

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

When we cry out for vengeance in place of justice or healing, when we shrink from telling the truth about Whose we are,

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

When we focus on our comfort and ignore the suffering of others, when all hope seems lost and God seems to have abandoned us,

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Whether in Jerusalem or Johannesburg, Israel or Ireland, the God of mercy has been made known to us in Jesus Christ, crucified Savior, who did not flinch in the face of death, but lived out God's love to his dying breath. For this let us give thanks to our God.

Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

Amen.

The readings and music of the Passion that we hear this Sunday lead us into the events of Holy Week and beyond. They are part of the unfolding mystery of Christ's life, death, and resurrection.

I warmly invite you to take note of the services offered throughout Holy Week and the Easter weekend, and to take part in them. It is through participation that these services become a living source of transformation in our lives.




