GREETINGS • NGĀ MIHI NUI

Breathing in Love; Breathing out Fear, a recent reflection from the Center for Action and Contemplation by Diana Butler Bass offers a thoughtful perspective on the Easter story and its meaning for our lives today.

Drawing on the Gospel of John, Bass reminds us that even after the resurrection, the disciples remained afraid—gathered behind locked doors when Jesus came among them, speaking words of peace and breathing new life into them. She traces how fear runs through the entire arc of the Christian story, from the angel's words to Mary, "Do not be afraid," to Jesus' final assurance of peace.

Yet this is not a story where fear has the last word. Instead, it is transformed. As the First Letter of John tells us, "perfect love casts out fear." Bass reflects that resurrection is not only something that happened to Jesus, but something that continues to happen within us—when fear gives way to love, and when we allow God's peace to reshape our hearts.

Through the simple, physical act of breathing, she points to a deeply embodied faith: breathing in peace, breathing out love. In this rhythm, we are invited into new life—released from fear and opened to compassion, connection, and hope.

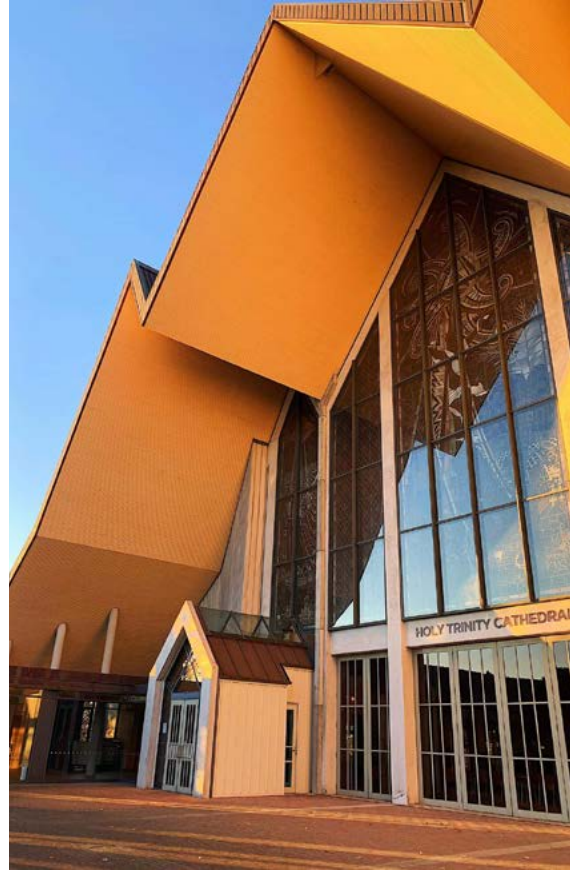
