GREETINGS • NGĀ MIHI NUI

Last week, the Cathedral forecourt became, for a little while, a place of quiet remembrance and prayer for the victims of the devastating flooding in Nepal and Tibet.

At the Mountain Fountain, a memorial wreath sponsored by Flowers after Hours, Parnell, and prayer station offered an invitation to pause, remember and hold in prayer those whose lives have been affected by the floods, as well as their families and communities.

In the midst of the movement and noise of the city, the station created a small space for silence and reflection open to everyone who happened to pass by. And many did stop.

Passersby paused on their way across the forecourt, some lingering for a few moments in silence, others taking time to pray. There was something quietly powerful about seeing people drawn into the space, each bringing their own thoughts, compassion and prayers, and sharing, however briefly, in a moment of collective remembrance for people suffering many thousands of kilometres away.

For those who stopped, even briefly, may that moment of stillness have been a small expression of solidarity with the people of Nepal and Tibet, and a reminder that compassion can cross borders, cultures and distances.

May we continue to hold all those affected by the floods in our prayers.

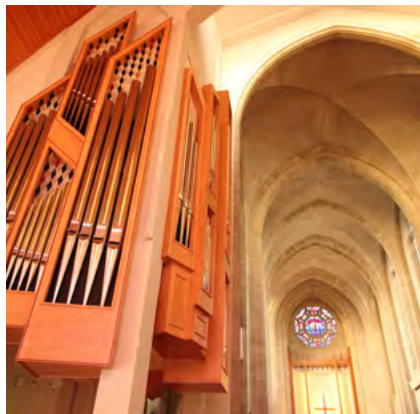
OPEN4EM MEETING

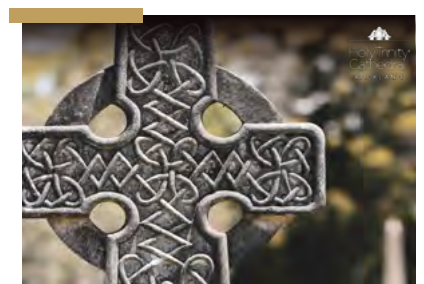

EVERY VOICE COUNTS

Are you enrolled to vote?

Common Grace Aotearoa is encouraging churches and faith communities to help ensure every voice is heard in this year's election.

Changes to New Zealand's electoral laws mean there is less time to enrol to vote, with enrolment no longer available on Election Day or during the two weeks before it. These changes may particularly affect people who are already marginalised, including renters and young people.

This initiative is not about telling people who to vote for, but about helping communities understand the changes, enrol in time and participate in our democracy.

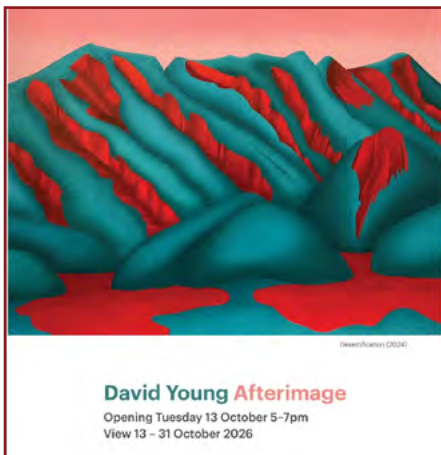
BOOK: PRIME MOVER

We pray for the families weighing dangerous journeys by sea, and for all who have lost loved ones to the water — that they would be spared, and that safer paths to protection would open.

We pray for the Rohingya people, stateless for nine years — that the world would not forget them, that the funding would be found, and that one day they might return home in safety and dignity.

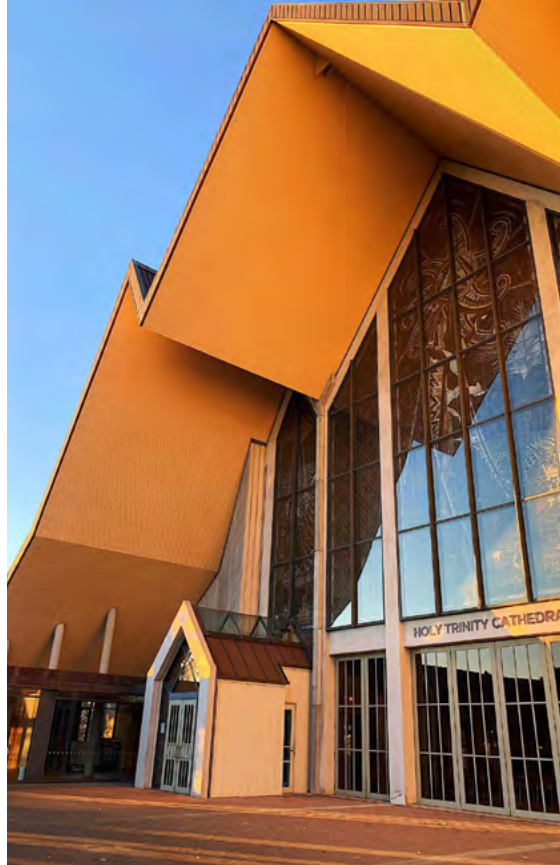
