On Monday evening, I had the privilege of attending the Pearl of the Islands Foundation Iftar dinner alongside several members of our Cathedral community, including our new Precentor, the Reverend Tony Kippax. 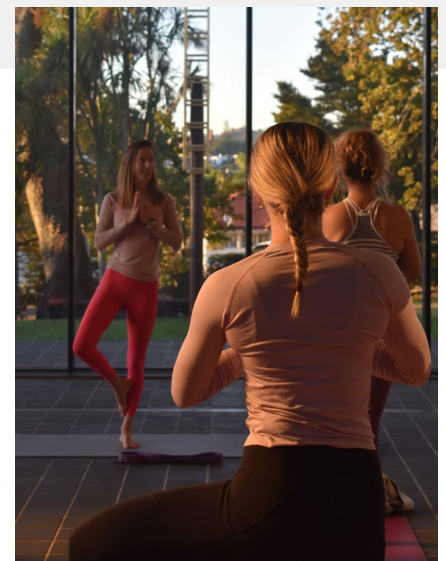
Join Dr Sarah Ferguson in Auckland's most breathtaking yoga venue for a charity yoga class.

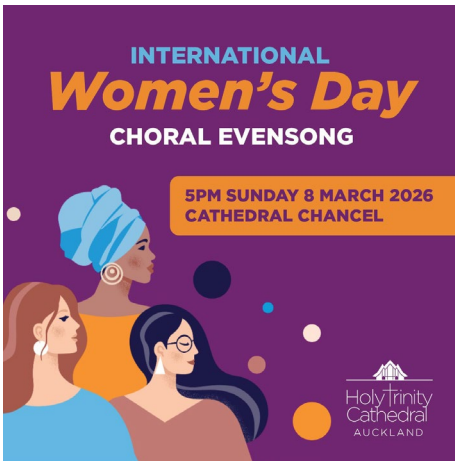

This uplifting service is an opportunity to honour and reflect on the continuing journey toward equality and justice.

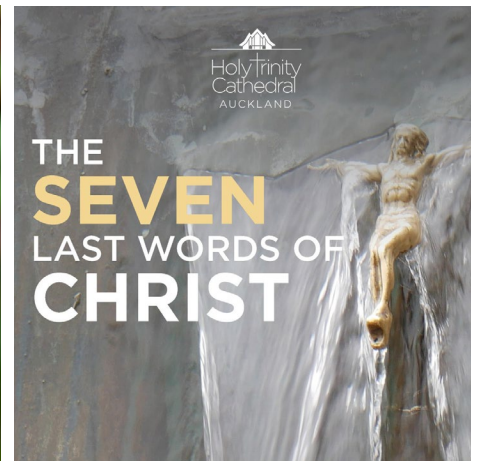

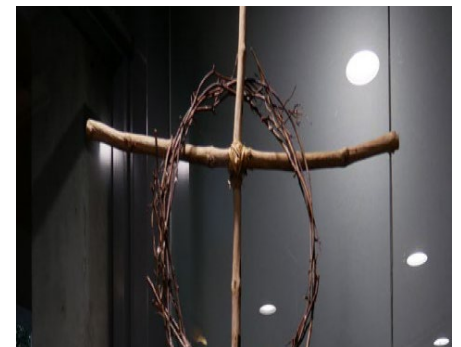

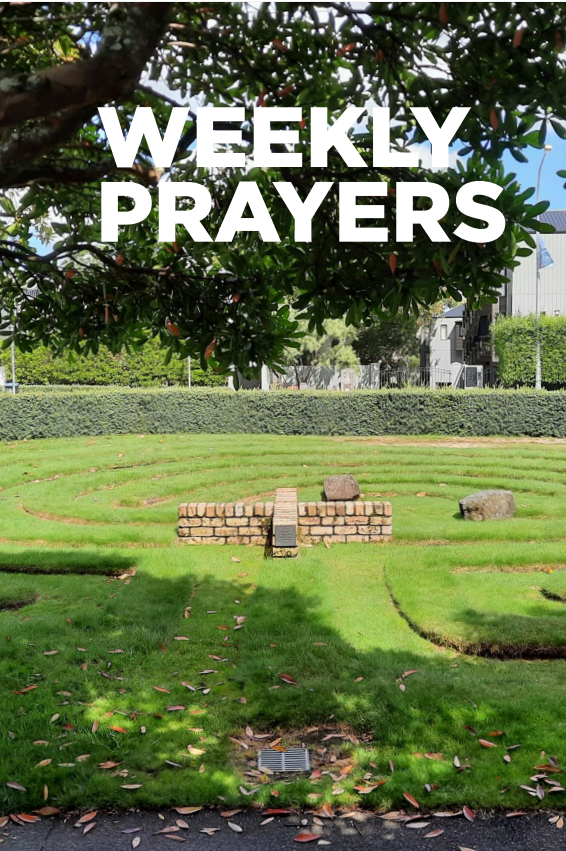
Please join the Cathedral community at 6pm on Maundy Thursday as we share a meal before the Festal Eucharist of the Last Supper at 7:30pm.

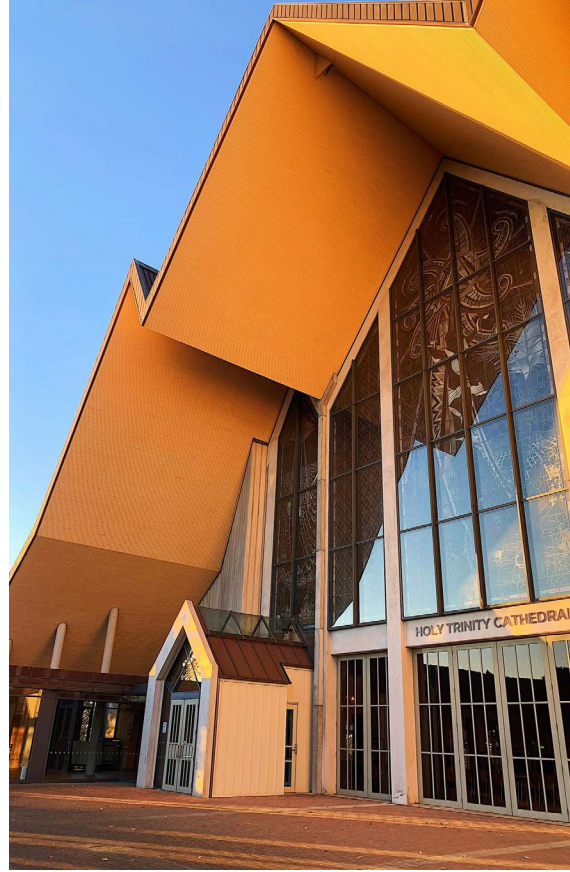
