Now that another busy year at the Cathedral is in full swing, I am increasingly aware of how much we need moments that slow us down and help us notice where God is already at work among us. Last Sunday, I had the privilege of preaching and presiding at St Bride's, Mauku, during their Patronal Festival, and of blessing three native trees planted in the regenerated bush behind the church. It was a simple act, yet rich with meaning—a sign of faith taking root and hope growing quietly over time.

That occasion led me to reflect on St Brigid of Ireland, whose life continues to speak powerfully into our own. Brigid reminds us that the light of Christ is not a firework or a spotlight. It is a steady, persistent glow, revealed in compassion, hospitality, and everyday acts of service. Her deep conviction that Christ dwells among the poor and vulnerable still shapes the heart of Christian ministry today.

In my blog post this month, I explore what Brigid's witness might offer us as a Cathedral community—how her generosity, courage, and bridge-building spirit invite us to carry Christ's light into ordinary places and daily encounters.

I hope this reflection offers you encouragement and space for prayer as we continue our journey together

All are welcome to come, receive the imposition of ashes, and begin Lent as part of the wider Christian community.




Holy Trinity Cathedral's Lenten Study Series this year is entitled *Holy silence; Holy noise*.


Discussions over three evenings will be facilitated by Barry Graves, Carolin Telford, Katharine Watts and Peter Watts.


COMMONWEALTH DAY SERVICE


