A CELEBRATION OF THE RESURRECTION THROUGH THE MUSIC OF STANFORD

5pm Easter Day - Sunday 31 March Holy Trinity Cathedral Officiant: Bishop Ross Bay

Lovers of Evensong will know well the many great settings of the Magnificat and Nunc dimittis by Charles Villiers Stanford.

Easter weekend this year marks 100 years since Stanford died (29 March 1924) and to acknowledge his amazing contribution to church music we have put together an Evensong service almost entirely of Stanford's music.

We sing his Magnificat and Nunc dimittis in G, his Easter anthem Why seek ye the living among the dead, his Te Deum in B flat, a hymn tune (Engelburg), a psalm setting and a fascinating new set of responses. Stanford didn't actually write any responses, but scholar Jeremy Dibble has put together a set based on extracts from many different works by the composer.

So for a real celebration of the great contribution Stanford made to Anglican church music, do join us at 5pm on Easter Day in the intimate setting of the Cathedral Chancel.
