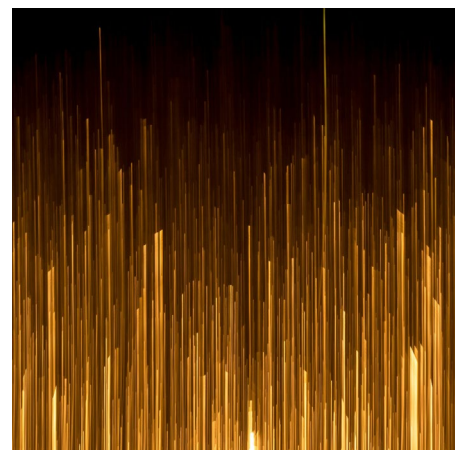

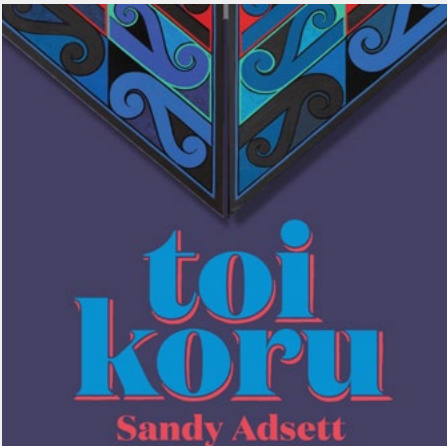
Join us for this special service which offers a rich tapestry of Eastertide liturgy and music, celebrating the resurrection of Christ with reverence and joy.

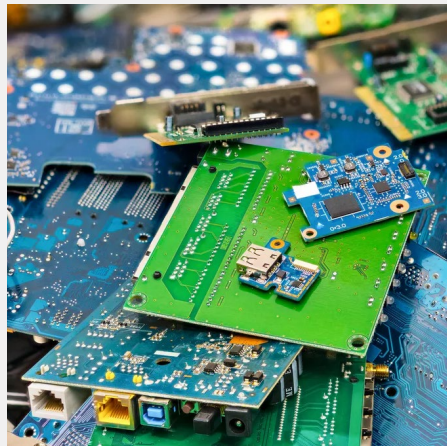


ART HOUSE TRUST EXHIBITION TOUR

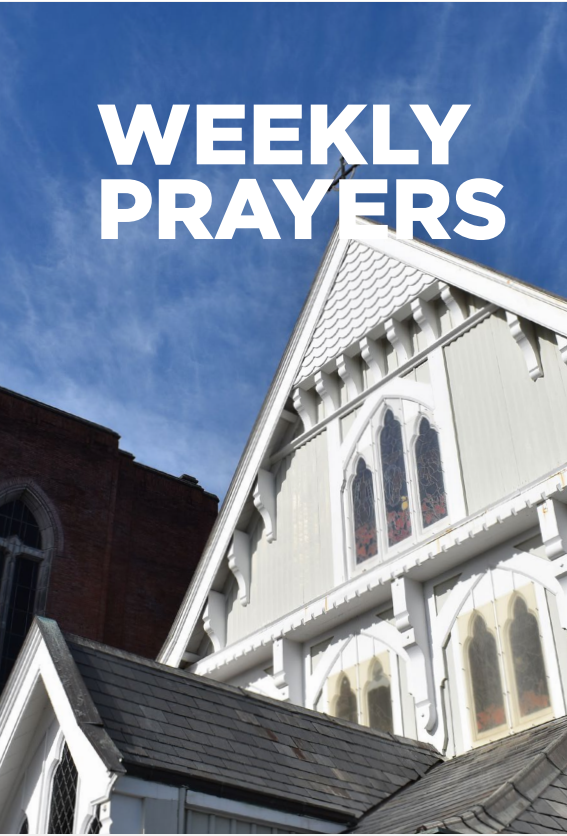

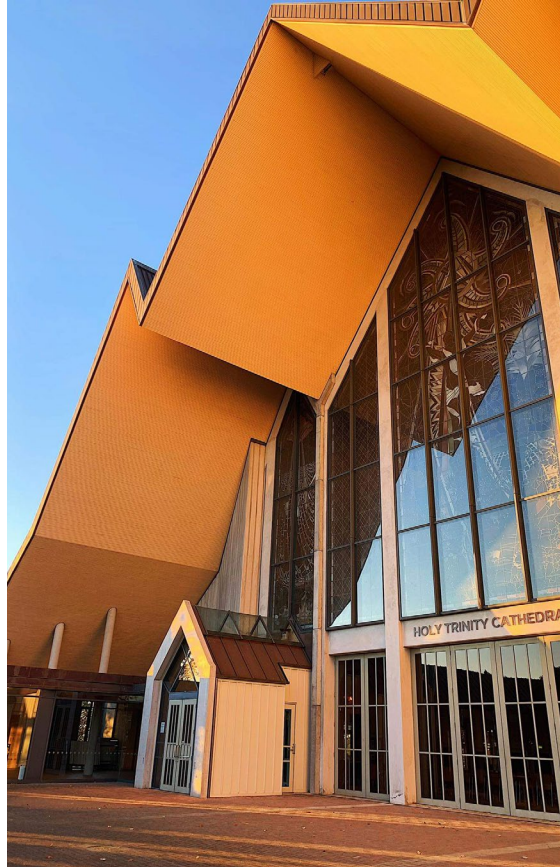
