## GREETINGS · *NGĀ MIHI NUI*

As you read this we will have entered the Easter Triduum. From sundown on Holy Thursday to sundown on Easter Sunday is considered the most solemn part of the liturgical year. This three-day period is referred to as the Easter Triduum, also known as the Holy Triduum, or Paschal Triduum. Triduum means "three days".

An important thing to understand is that the Holy Triduum is one great festival recounting the last three days of Jesus' life on earth, the events of his Passion and Resurrection, and when the Lamb of God laid down his life in atonement for our sins.

Hence, participating in the services of the Holy Triduum is the most solemn and meaningful way to celebrate Easter. The liturgical reform of the 20th century has renewed this ancient practice and we are encouraged to take part in the services of the Holy Triduum – on Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and the Easter Vigil, and continued through to our Easter Day services.

Celebrating each of the services of the Holy Triduum takes time and commitment. Many suggest that it is good to celebrate it at least once – the experience of many is that it then becomes a cherished and significant way to celebrate Easter.

We are looking forward to seeing you with us during this weekend. The details of all the services from Maundy Thursday until Easter Sunday can be found in this newsletter.

**ST GEORGE'S COLLEGE, JERUSALEM: SONGS OF SUFFERING AND HOPE**

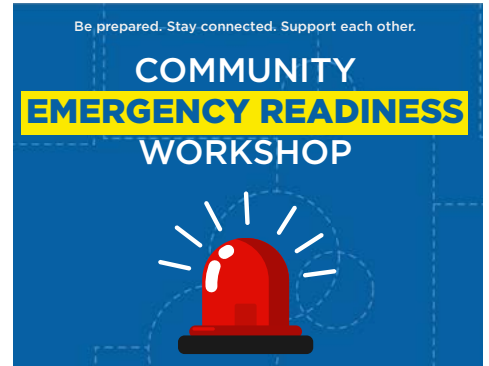

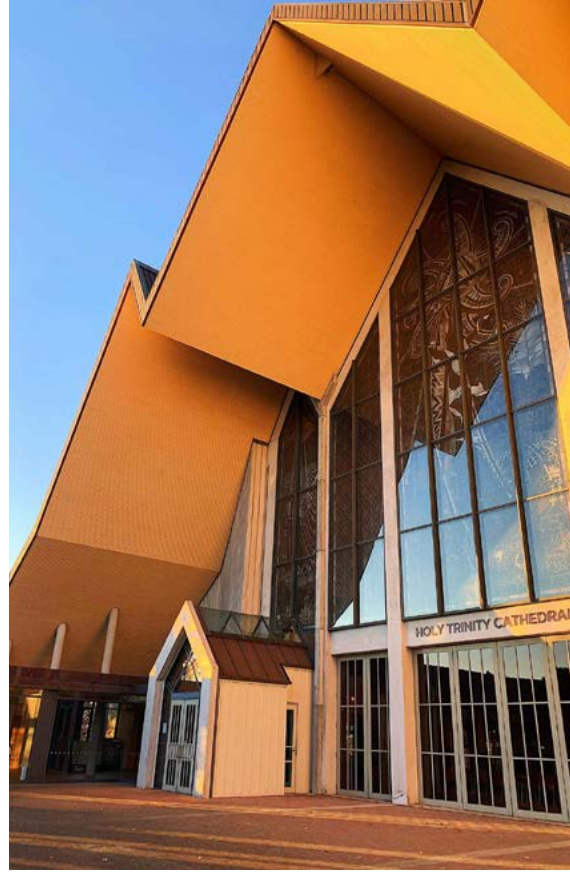
